FROM THE PASTOR...

The annual congregational meeting is over. Our 2015 church budget is now set. 6 new Council members have been elected. Souper Bowl Sunday, on February 1 will likely bring us extra joy as we welcome and worship with our friends from St. John's, Hamburg (whose worship space is currently being renovated). The winter is moving on and has been less harsh that 2014 was. (Hold that thought as we enter February!)

THE HOLY SEASON OF Lent will begin on Ash Wednesday, February 18. Please be attentive to the spiritual disciplines that have long been practiced by Christian people. If you are unfamiliar with what Lent is all about, let me assist you: 1. Practice some "self-denial" in some way, maybe by "giving up something" to honor the fact that God "gave up" his son, Jesus. 2. Worship **more often** that you already are. 3. Pray more. Do daily devotions. 4. **Deepen your faith** by engaging in the study of scripture. 5. Consider doing



something different or extra each day to make your life a little more "Christ-like."

Zion's Lutheran Church will offer extra mid-week worship opportunities each Wednesday at 11 am with Soup/Bread following and again in the evening 5:45 pm. Soup/Bread, 6:15 Lenten Scripture Study with Pastor Bruce called, "The Parables of Lent", 7 pm. Worship 7:45 pm. The Adult Choir will rehearse.

Pick up and read a copy of a daily Lenten devotional booklet called "living the Gospel Life: Daily Devotions for Christians on a Mission" which will be available beginning Sunday, February 15.

Enroll your child in preparation to receive his/her First Communion. Classes for all ages

will be held on Sundays, March 8,15,22,29 after the 10:30 am worship service. Parents should speak with me about their child's readiness to receive the Sacrament, kindergarten age and older. If your child is regular in worship, he/she is probably ready to learn more about it.

Encourage someone you know (or you yourself) to be baptized on Holy Saturday, The Vigil of Easter, at the new 7 pm. worship service on April 4th. Worship will begin outdoors (with a fire) and continues in the dark church as we wait for the Easter joy. If you would like to receive special instruction for baptism during the 6 weeks of

Lent, please speak with Pastor Bruce. All ages are welcome to inquire. Do you know someone who needs to begin their relationship with God and receive his promises in baptism?

Plan now to come to our first ever Children's Worship service on Easter Sunday at 9 am as our children and youth share with you their Easter joy! But first, let's walk the Lenten walk together and follow Jesus to the cross of Calvary.

I hope to see you in church during Lent.

ASH WEDNESDAY SERVICES

The season of Lent begins with Ash Wednesday. This year it is the 18th of February. There will be two opportunities for worship on that day, one at 11 am. and one beginning at 5:45 pm. The rite of the imposition of ashes on worshippers' foreheads will be observed at both services, as will the celebration of communion.

Next to Good Friday, Ash Wednesday is one of the most solemn days of the church year with its focus upon the remembrance of our sinful nature and our need for God through Jesus Christ to declare our sins forgiven. It begins a 40 day journey that leads Christ's disciples, you and me, through the suffering and death of Jesus to his glorious resurrection. I look forward to beginning this year's journey with you on February 18th!

This year we will be celebrating the Lenten Season with services held on Wednesdays February 18,25/March 4,11,18,25.

LENTEN PROJECT

This year's Lenten Project will be "Save in a PIGGY Bank"!! We will be handing out piggy banks for anyone to collect loose change to buy a piglet for a family in need. When this little piggy grows up, she will give birth to as many as 16 piglets each year. Pigs help fertilize fields, provide food to eat and can be sold at market for much-needed income. What a BIG difference a piglet can make! Banks will be available on the table in the Narthex. Coloring books about God's Global Barnyard will also be available for the little ones.

Do you like to read? Want to join a Zion's Book Group?

Pastor Bruce would like to try and start a book reading group that meets at Zion's Lutheran Church one evening per month. The group would meet at 7 p.m. in the Church Library. Group members can suggest possible books. Those who participate can be involved in setting up a schedule of books to read. The first book will be "Orphan Train" by Christina Baker Kline by William Morrow-An Imprint of Harper Collins Publishers. The group will meet on Thursday, February 26. You can purchase the book at Barnes-Noble in Wyomissing, order it on Amazon and have it delivered to your house, or get it from the local library. Note that the book has 3 great features in the back, 1. About the author 2. A Short History of the Real Orphan Trains and 3. a Reading Group Guide. Try and answer the questions as you read the book so that we can discuss them when we are together later in February. So that Pastor Bruce knows there are interested people, please sign up for the group on the church bulletin board or email him at pastorbruce@zionslutheran.org.

To whet your appetite for "Orphan Train", this back cover quote: It is a poignant and memorable story of 2 steadfast, courageous women (one, a 90 year old Irish immigrant and the other, a 17 year old named Molly Ayer, a casualty of a string of foster homes). Moving between contemporary Maine and Depression-era Minnesota, it is a revelation of the universal yearning for belonging, for family, for acceptance, and ultimately, the journeys we must all make to find them. It is on the New York Times Best Seller list.

Some Congregational Pastoral Care Notes:

- 1. As Pastor Bruce becomes more familiar with congregational members, he would like to assemble information about the location of Zion's related family members, especially those who reside in nursing homes, assisted-living, private homes, and senior adult apartments whether they are members of Zion's or not. It is his intention to expand Zion's care of senior adults and anyone who has special needs. Members are asked to give this information to him as they are able.
- 2. When you are admitted to the hospital, please let the church office know or call Pastor Bruce directly at 610-914-2795. Please do not assume that he knows or recalls what you have told him in the greeting line after worship. A reminder is helpful and appreciated.
- 3. Signing up for a home visit or inviting the Pastor to meet you for your lunch break (we can go Dutch) is a great way to deepen your relationship with him. Possible days are listed by morning, afternoon, and evening on a list outside of the church office door. He will call you to confirm the visit, ahead of time. Other days and dates may be possible so you can also speak with him directly to arrange those.
- 4. Receiving the Sacrament of Holy Communion at home or wherever a member lives is always possible and can be requested at any time by calling the church office and leaving a message. Those who reside in facilities where worship services are conducted weekly and encouraged by Pastor Bruce to participate in them.

A future late spring "Vehicular Show" at Zion's

is in the talking stages. Do you have an antique vehicle, an old car, old truck, old tractor, old motorcycle that you could bring to church <u>on a Sunday morning/early afternoon</u> to "show off"? Do you know someone else who does? Could you invite them to participate? Are you interested in helping plan this event? Consider speaking with Bettie Hirko and Pastor Bruce during February as a planning group will be formed in March to plan the May event.

On a future Sunday afternoon: Hike to Pulpit Rock and The Pinnacle and eat a packed lunch along the way?

You bet! When the youth group walked the trail to the North Lookout at Hawk Mountain back on December 28, Pastor Bruce learned of the years ago tradition of doing this after worship on a Sunday.

We would leave from the Reservoir Parking lot but other than that, no date has been set for it. We need a planning group of local "experts" who have done it to help choose a date and make some detailed logistical plans. If interested, let Dave Mengel, Dwight Heckman or Pastor Bruce know.

Lent is about remembering the passion and death of Jesus Christ. Lent is studying the life of Jesus, who suffered and died on the cross. Lent is a 40 days period (excluding Sundays) to focus on God's gift of Jesus, who died to save all people from their sins.
