

'A Happy Family"

Kyomugisha Shadresi, the mother of five children ages 3 to 13, lives in a rural village in Uganda. She and her youngest daughter, Prossy, had been sick off and on for some time before finally visiting the health center – where they were both diagnosed with HIV. Upon hearing the news, Kyomugisha's husband sold everything he could and deserted the family, leaving them nearly destitute. Kyomugushi took on whatever work she could do, earning barely enough to feed her family.

CHURCH COUNCIL CORNER

The meeting opened with devotions read by Brian Moroney. Duane Epting from Strausser Insurance Agency was on hand to discuss insuring our church; Zurich has opted out of handling policies for churches. In the end, we will receive better coverage, better defined benefits at a reasonable rate. The proposal was put forth in a motion, seconded and carried.

Water Softener repair or replacement-Mike Puglia attended the meeting to discuss two options considered by the Property Committee to correct the brown water issue we have been experiencing at the church. After discussion, council found it prudent to replace the system rather than just the metered valve head due to the age of the entire system.

Treasurer's Report- we continue to slide further into the red...we are currently at \$16,832.59 in the red and the congregational approved figure for 2015 was \$24,590.08 in the red. At this rate we will be over the approved budget by the end of this summer. To overcome this deficit, we as a congregation would need to bring in \$4,300 a week to erase the red ink on our ledger. We look forward to open and honest discussion of this subject over the next several weeks.

Stewardship Committee needs volunteers/members! Please consider giving of your time and talent to this very important committee. Inquiries should be directed to Pastor Bruce or Allan Cornman.

A proposed Summer Schedule of Worship has been introduced by Pastor Bruce based on the worship survey that was passed out April 19th. 66 responses were returned and based on the results Pastor Bruce has taken his conclusions to the Worship and Music committee on May 13th. The results are interesting with a proposed Saturday 5pm service and a Sunday 9am service. Pastor Bruce has been VERY busy with hospital and home visits the past month as well as talking to new prospective members for Zion's with eight new members received on May 17th.

There is a need for two Sunday School teachers for the fall of 2015. PLEASE consider taking one of these positions.

June 7th Shoey Park Worship-If you are planning to attend this service, please bring a chair with you.



The Homeless Donkey Who Taughi Me about Life, Faith, and Second Chances is the most delightful story I have read in a long time. A bedraggled donkey and a stressed out family are serendipitously brought together in a heartwarming true tale of the unique blessings that animals can bring into our lives. This amazing writer uses humor and wit to share her family's adventures with Flash, who shows up unexpectedly one night and captures their hearts with his quirky antics. The author sees his annual as God's special gift during a difficult saason of life. Her journey of faith and trust is set in motion by her unlikely involvement with this donkey, who displays simple yet profound lessons in his daily activities that Ridge insightfully applies to her own life. Knowing whose you are, finding sanctuary in God alone, serving others in love, choosing gratitude and forgiveness — these are just some of the "lessons from Flash" described in this book, i also enjoyed the photos of Flash in each chaptar and learning more about the roles donkeys have played in Biblical timas and throughout history. A laugh out loud, hard to put down kind of book that uplifts the spirit and opens the eyes to see God's goodness and glory in the simple things of daily life.

April 19th Worship Survey - Brief Summary of the Results

+ 66 responses were returned. 50 of them were returned on April 19th. Many were not completely filled out. + 37
favor 9 a.m. worship from Mcmorial Day through Labor Day. 22 chose June 14 through the end of August. 7 chose keep it the way it is year round. + 34 attend weekly. 26 attend almost weekly. 7 attend monthly. + 26 said they would attend an alternative service. 25 said no they would not. + Saturday at 5 p.m. was the first clear choice. Thursday at 8 p.m. was second. Wednesday at 7 p.m. was third. + 26 want more audio-visual use. 16 do not. + 17 said they would attend worship at an alternative location. 6 said they would attend a Growth in Faith summer event.

Based on the results of the survey, Pastor Bruce proposed and the Worship/Music Committee and the Congregation Council approved a summer worship schedule that includes **one Sunday morning worship** at 9 a.m. beginning on Sunday, June 14 and **a new Saturday evening worship** opportunity at 5 p.m. which will begin on Sat., June 6.

Zion's Summer Worship will have these characteristics:

+ A "Favorite" Hymn will be sung each Summer Saturday/Sunday. 4 will be sung on June 21 at worship.

+ The 4th Sundays (June 28, July 26 and August 23) will be noncommunion Sundays and would include a Community Speaker.

+ Every Saturday will include Holy Communion by Intinction.

Worship will be held indoors (in The Gold Room) or outdoors depending on the heat, humidity, weather, at the discretion of the pastor. If outdoors, then the location might be anywhere on the property. Worshippers may have to find the benches! Lawn chairs are encouraged and optional on any given Saturday. Some wooden benches have been borrowed from the Perry Township Recreation Center for our use.

+ Saturday dress is casual.

+ 3rd Sundays, July 19 and August 16 will use the talents of our Contemporary musicians except in June)

+ A Children's Sermon will be given every Sunday and placed after The Prayer of the Day rather than right before the regular sermon.

+ On the 2nd Sundays after 9 a.m. worship, a Family Outing will be offered. Families would be encouraged to bring a picnic meal to eat at the designated location. (June 10, July 12, August 9)



ZION'S LUTHERAN CHURCH Shoemakersville, Pennsylvania Our Peace Candle / Prayer Tradition

In 1985, the Rev. Blair R. Monie, Pastor of the First Presbyterian Church in York, Pennsylvania, visited the Soviet Union. In the small town of Voronezh, an old woman approached him and pressed a small sum of money into his hand and asked that he do something for world peace. He recognized a deep desire and strong devotion in her eyes and in her voice and determined that he would do something special when he returned to the United States.

What could he do with three rubles? After much thought, he purchased a small votive candle, placed it on the Communion Table and lit it. After hearing his story, the congregation agreed to make it a permanent accessory of the chancel and purchased a supply of votive candles so that they could make a "peace candle" available to any visitor to take back to his/her sanctuary.

When we see the glow of our peace candle burning, we offer our prayers for peace. This small, non-threatening symbol of peace helps us to be praying people and to play our part as peacemakers, as Jesus called us to do. Today, these candles, burn in the United States, England, Australia, Canada, Ireland, Kuwait, South Africa, and Denmark.

Our candle came to us from The Lutheran Church of the Resurrection in Yardley, Pennsylvania. Please accept this candle for your congregation with our best wishes.
