FROM THE PASTOR..

The holy season of Lent began on Ash Wednesday, February 18. I hope that many of you are participating in the spiritual disciplines that have long been practiced by Christian people. It is never too late to begin to observe Lent. If you only partially succeed, try harder the next week. Remember that it is all about you and your relationship to God. God wants to be in relationship with you. God's mercy and forgiveness is available and accessible to all. Think about what God has done for you in the person and the example of his son, Jesus.

Zion's Lutheran Church offers an extra mid-week worship opportunity each Wednesday at 11 a.m. with Soup/Bread following and again in the evening 5:45 p.m. Soup/Bread, 6:15 Lenten Scripture Study with Pastor Bruce called "The Parables of Lent" 7 p.m. Lenten Worship held in our Gold Room "Lenten Chapel". On Thursday, March 5 at 11:30 a.m.. Zion's Lutheran welcomes other Christians from the congregations of the Northern Berks Ministerium for Lenten devotions and soup.

Use a daily **Lenten devotional booklet** called "Living the Gospel



Life: Daily Devotions for Christians on a Mission" that you could find on the lobby table.

Preparation for First Communion has begun. Participating in the classes on Sundays, March 8,15,22,29 can benefit ANYONE OF ANY AGE WHO WANTS TO LEARN MORE ABOUT THIS HOLY MEAL. Parents should speak with me about their child's readiness to receive the Sacrament, Kindergarten age and older. If your child is regular in worship, he/she is probably ready to learn more about it.

Encourage someone you know (or you yourself) to be baptized on Holy Saturday, The Vigil of Easter, at the new 7 p.m. worship service. on April 4th. Worship will begin outdoors (with a fire) and continues in the dark church as we wait for the Easter joy. If you would like to receive special

instruction for baptism during the 6 weeks of Lent, please speak with Pastor Bruce. All ages are welcome to inquire. Do you know someone who needs to begin their relationship with God and receive his promises in baptism?

Plan now to come to our **first** ever Children's Worship service on Easter Sunday at 9 a.m. as our children and youth share with you their Easter joy! But first, let's walk the Lenten walk together and follow Jesus to the cross of Calvary. If you are unfamiliar with what Lent is all about, let me assist you: 1. Practice some "self-denial" in some way, maybe by "giving up something" to honor the fact that God "gave up" his Son, Jesus. 2. Worship more often than you already are. 3. Pray more. Do daily devotions. 4. Deepen your **faith** by engaging in the study of scripture. 5. Consider doing something different or extra each day to make your life a little more "Christ-like." 6. Engage in a new activity that strengthens your life and faith.

Like anything else in life, you get out of "it" (Lent) what you put into it. I hope to see you in church during Lent!

Tools to stay healthy - Burundi

Euphrasie and her daughter used to fall ill frequently. Even when they went to the health center, they would often get sick again. That is, until your gifts to the ELCA Malaria Campaign, working with The Lutheran World Federation, came to Euphrasie's village.

The Lutheran malaria program in Burundi provided Euphrasie and people in her village with education about how malaria is transmitted and how people can prevent it. "They told us how to recognize malaria symptoms of a child or adult," Euphrasie says. "When [my daughter] got sick again, I took her to the health center. They examined her and found malaria. Thanks to the teaching I had received, I administered the medication [correctly] and she finished the dose."

Euphrasie reports that both she and her daughter suffer from malaria far less frequently than before, and they have the tools they needed to stay healthy.

"We now know the kind of things we should do [in our home]; to remove bushes, weeds, and grass outside the home, "she reports, cleaning up the areas where mosquitoes can breed.

Your gifts to the ELCA Malaria Campaign are helping to prevent cases of malaria and end deaths from this preventable, treatable disease for communities and families like Euphrasis's. Thank you.

Some Congregational Pastoral Care Notes:

- 1. As Pastor Bruce becomes more familiar with congregational members, he would like to assemble information about the location of Zion's related family members, especially those who reside in nursing homes, assisted-living, private homes, and senior adult apartments whether they are members of Zion's or not. It is his intention to expand Zion's care of senior adults and anyone who has special needs. Members are asked to give this information to him as they are able.
- 2. When you are admitted to the hospital, please let the church office know or call Pastor Bruce directly at 610-914-2795. Please do not assume that he knows or recalls what you have told him in the greeting line after worship. A reminder is helpful and appreciated.
- 3. **Signing up for a home visit or inviting the Pastor to meet you for your lunch break** (we can go Dutch) is a great way to deepen your relationship with him. Possible days are listed by morning, afternoon, and evening on a list outside of the church office door. He will call you to confirm the visit, ahead of time. Other days and dates may be possible so you can speak with him directly to arrange those visits.
- 4. **Receiving the Sacrament of Holy Communion at home** or wherever a member lives is always possible and **can be requested at any time** by calling the church office and leaving a message. Those who reside in facilities where worship services are conducted weekly and encouraged by Pastor Bruce to participate in them.


