### From the Pastor...

Dear Members and Friends of Zion's,

What a turbulent time it is, in the world's history, to be a "religious" person. Many people in the world, some who don't even regularly practice their faith with other people, think that "religious people" only care about other people who believe like they do. "Overly zealous religious people" (I will call them), "read and interpret literally" their sacred writings and then proceed to criticize, judge, condemn, exclude and in fact, sometimes even kill, people who don't believe like they do.

During the week of Sept. 21-25, I participated in the Berks Business and Education Coalition's effort to help county 9<sup>th</sup> graders think about their future careers. The 9<sup>th</sup> graders visited the larger places of work in our county, then returned to their school to reflect on what they learned. Volunteers from the community came in and led the reflection time also sharing their careers as well. I visited Antietam, Muhlenberg and Hamburg High Schools for one hour to help with this. It is in 9<sup>th</sup> Grade, the research says, that those who teach can accurately predict a student's future success in school and in life. Getting 9<sup>th</sup> graders to think about the future is an important thing to do in motivating them to succeed and do their best, giving their best effort.

A student at Antietam actually asked me this question: **WOULD I CARE ABOUT PEOPLE WHO BELIEVED DIFFERENTLY THAN I DID?** It was a telling question for our age, in my opinion. I looked the student in the eye and said, "All people have value in God's eyes. All 9<sup>th</sup> graders need to do their best in school. That's why I am here today, to encourage all of you to

do that." (Who says they don't talk religion in school anymore?)

On Saturday, October 17, one of the offered classes will be a panel discussion on Ministry in Daily Life. 5 individuals will talk about how they see their career, their work, as ministry. Doing this kind of reflection is a uniquely Lutheran thing to do. Practicing our Christian faith daily has never been a more important thing to do than it is right now, at this time, in history. 500 years ago, Martin Luther said that "all people are priests" (the priesthood of all believers). This statement rings very true today!

On Sunday, October 25 at 10:30 a.m. 4 of our young people, Brett Daub, Mackenzie Stocks, Autumn Eyer, and Julia Doklan will become adult members of our faith community. This means that we think they have been prepared for the rigors of Christian life. Our prayer is that they have been and will continue to be.

### Please join us for worship this month.

Participate in our classes of study. Grow in your faith and in life your whole life long! Don't ever think that you know it all or ever have all of the answers to life's questions. (Lord knows, I don't) In this crazy world, we all need to be working on that, don't you think?

### **TABLE SERVICE**

A free meal, time of prayer and opportunities to serve and be served are what is offered weekly at Shobi's Table – a food truck that serves homeless and near – homeless residents of St. Paul, Minnesota.

Pastor Margaret Mary Kelley and Noah have both been there from the beginning. Noah, once homeless in the Twin Cities, was keenly aware of the limited dietary options for those living on extreme margins. Together, they worked to find a solution.

Their solution came in the form of a food truck – a vehicle that would allow them to serve freshly prepared meals and bring food to the community at a location that was a natural gathering place for many. Pastor Margaret and Noah have been able to serve around 75-100 neighbors a week since 2014. "When the church does community well, we do it well," shared Pastor Margaret. "We come around the table to gather for lunch and God's meal; people need a lot of both."

Community is at the heart of Shobi's Table's mission. What is Shobi's Table's hope for the future? Their long-term goal is to acquire a bus that would offer indoor and outdoor seating to protect their patrons from the cold Minnesota winter months and to expand their offerings to include vocational training. Each plan is designed to lead them one step closer to accomplishing their mission – to provide food, friendship, faith and employment skills to the homeless and near-homeless people of St. Paul.

#### And the harvest continues...

To date this season, we have distributed 5,301 pounds of produce to needy area families and individuals. We are starting to harvest our fall crops, including lettuce, kale, cabbage, beets and a new crop of green beans. You are welcome to join us on Monday mornings at 8:00 am or Thursday evenings at 6:00 pm through the end of October.

### Season 2 is coming to an end...

Our second season will be wrapping up next month. Please mark your calendars for Saturday, November 7<sup>th</sup> at 9 am when we will be putting the Garden to rest until the spring. Watch the bulletins and next month's newsletter for more details.

#### Check this out!

We are starting to compile recipes from Garden volunteers and friends, using vegetables that we grow in the Garden. These recipes will be made available with our food pantry distributions. Check Zion's website for Garden Recipes, Volume 1 (September 2015). Here are some sample recipes to try. Enjoy!

### **Zucchini Cocoa Bars**

½ cup cocoa

Sift together:

2 cups flour

2 Tablespoons vanilla

1 ½ cups sugar

½ cup vegetable or canola oil

1 teaspoon salt

2 cups grated zucchini

1 ½ teaspoons baking soda (peeling is optional)

1/3 cup cold coffee 1/2 cup raisins

½ cup chopped walnuts

Mix well, spread in 11x15 inch greased and floured pan (jelly roll pan). Bake at 350 degrees for 25 minutes. Cool and cut.

### Swiss Chard (or Kale) Frittata recipe

1 lb chopped and deveined Swiss chard (or kale), 5 eggs, 1/3 cup milk, 3 T parm. cheese, 1/4 tsp salt, 2 cups cooked spaghetti or other noodles, 1 T butter, 1 cup provolone or mozzarella cheese.

Rinse chard. With a little water still on leaves, cook to wilt in skillet on medium heat 5-10 minutes. Remove chard. Add butter to coat pan. Preheat broiler. Combine chard, eggs, milk, parmesan, salt, noodles. Stir well so eggs are scrambled. Cook in skillet on stovetop until eggs are done. Add provolone cheese and place in broiler until melted.
