Dear Zion Friends,

The season of Lent is upon us already, a bit earlier than last year. It is my favorite liturgical season, I have to admit. Our focus on the life and death of Christ, with all of its' passion and drama, makes it easy to tell the "old, old story of Jesus and his love."

In our 21st century world, where Christianity is under fire from the culture and being misunderstood around the globe, it is important for the Zion's faith community to stay focused on the details of the Jesus' life. **By modeling our lives after Jesus,** we still find meaning, purpose and direction for ourselves as individuals and for our community of believers.

As Christians have long done, we will gather more frequently for prayer, study, fellowship and worship during the 6 weeks of Lent. During Lent, our Sunday School will be collecting school supplies for schools faraway. Our kids will be learning how pencils, paper and supplied are craved by children all over the world, something, we take for granted.

Do a devotion daily. Take time to pray. Stop and think. Meditate on how our Christian life is and should be different from the world around us. Focus on God and others not on self. Try and put "sin" aside. Work on making yourself a more God-like person.

Know in your heart that you can't do it without God's love. You can't save yourself or this

world. Only God can do that. Look at how God does it!

As we begin this journey to the garbage dump called "Calvary", may the refuse of our lives be

Thank you to everyone who contributed generously in December, 2015 helping Zion's Lutheran to end the year with a greatly reduced deficit! More than \$37,000 was contributed by members and friends in December!

For tax preparation purposes, and because of the 100 year record blizzard on Jan.22-3, the 2015 Final Statements of Giving were mailed out on Monday, January 25, 2016.

Please consider doing your giving on-line using the church's website. The procedure is very user friendly. Giving in this way saves paper, saves staff time posting your gifts, and helps our congregation enter the electronic age.

Each Year, Zion's Lutheran earns some significant income from saving Redner's Tapes. If you would like to participate in this program, it's easy, just get a savea-tape card at the store, give it to the cashier and put your register tapes in the basket in the narthex. Remember, all tapes must say Save-A-Tape on them to be eligible for this program.

SAVE-A-TAPE

Zions collects Redner's receipts in order to receive 1% of the recorded total purchases turned in. However, you MUST present a "Pump Perks" card (even if you don't use it for gas) in order for Zion's to receive the 1% back from Redner's. Receipts without this are ineligible! If you don't have a "Pump Perks" card, stop at Customer Service to get one. Please get a card and use it when you are at the check-out register. Bring in your entire Save-A-Tape receipt and put it in the basket in the nave. Keep those receipts coming!!!!

WINTER WEATHER AND WORSHIP

Our December giving totaled \$37,741.80 which reduced our 2015 deficit by almost \$20,000. Thank you to everyone who made this possible. We are truly a blessed church family.

Brian Moroney updated us on the church's water situation. After much effort and investigation as to what our obligation is in regard to state regulations, our water system is now in total compliance with all standards, both now and moving forward. Our church water is safe for drinking. Thank you to Brian and our Property Committee for their many hours of work to make sure we are meeting these requirements.

A Big Thank You to Joe Leone for his 4 year analysis of Zion's Giving and Spending. His CPA skills are a valuable asset to our organization. His analysis and input give us a better understanding of where we've ben and where we are going.

Council addressed the recent resignation of our longtime secretary, Elaine Schroeder, and our plan for moving forward. The Personnel Committee is in the process of reviewing the Secretary Job Description and are proceeding with a plan to find a replacement. We thank Elaine for her many years of service to Zion's. We will miss her services.

Zion's Congregation Council is always changing its make-up. We want to thank those members who are leaving Council for their self-less dedication of time and talents. We eagerly welcome all of the new members who agree to serve in the coming years.

"Giving Up Popularity"

What is the Season of Lent all about?

Lent is about remembering the passion and death of Jesus Christ. Lent is studying the life of Jesus, who suffered and died on the cross. Lent is a 40 days period (excluding Sundays) to focus on God's gift of Jesus, who died to save all people from their sins. Lent is about practicing some "self-denial", trying to make one's life a little more God-like. Believers set time aside each day for personal devotors. Believers fight the urge to be "too busy". They meditate. They rest. They reflect. They invite others to consider practicing the faith. They encourage. They pray.

How long have Christians been observing Lent?

Faithful Christians have long used the 6 weeks of Lent to prepare themselves to belebrate Christ's Resurrection on Easter. It has always been a time of preparation and instruction for new Christians. Is there someone you know who wishes to grow closer to God? Lent is a great time to invite them to do that.

How can I participate in the disciplines of Lenten?

By worshipping regularly. By studying the Sible regularly with others. By "giving up" something because God "gave up" Jesus. By giving more. By practicing self-discipline. By serving others more. By praying more. By doing daily devotions. By making a life change that brings you closer to God. By working hard at being a "Christian". By mylling someone else you know to deepen their faith and then walking with them during Lent.

Anyone desiring the Sacrament of Holy Baptiam for themselves (or for their children) is invited to contact Paster Bruce as soon as possible to begin preparations. Baptisms will be celebrated at *The Vigil of Easter service on Saturday, March 26 at 7 p.m.*, which is a very special night to be baptized. We begin in the darkness of Lent and end with the light of Easter.
