#### FROM THE PASTOR... Dear Zion Friends,

**More than 70 years ago,** before the invention of the fax machine, the cell phone, and the personal computer, World War 2 era theologian and Pastor Dietrich Bonhoeffer wrote these words:

"Every word is alive and is at home in a certain place. The word in the family is different from the word in the office or in public. The word that is born in the warmth of personal relationship freezes in the cold air of the public. The word of command, which comes out of public service, would cut the bonds of trust in the family. Every word is supposed to have its place and stay in it. As a consequence of the spread of the public word in newspapers and radio, the nature and boundaries of various words are no longer felt clearly, and indeed the special character of the personal word has been **destroyed.** (Bold is mine) In place of genuine words, we now have chatter. Words no longer have any weight. There is too much talk. (Italics are mine) When the boundaries of various words are erased. however, when words become rootless and homeless, the word loses truth, and this almost necessarily gives rise to the lie. When the various conventions of life are no longer mutually observed, then words become untrue." Dietrich thought that there was a lot of communication using words back then? Imagine what Dietrich would say now! We are bombarded with words all the time! The printed word in newspapers and books has undergone and is undergoing massive transformation in our world today. Children no longer are taught to cursively write. When was the last time you "wrote" a letter with a pen and actually put it in an envelope with a stamp and mailed it? Maybe you have never sent an email or a text message. If you haven't, just imagine a typewriter attached to a telegraph machine that sends its signal through the air!

I have been a pastor for 31 years now. When I was in seminary, way back in the dark ages of 1982-1986, I typed my term papers on a typewriter and used carbon paper. The church offices used mimeograph machines with that great smelling ink! Now I have to take cell phones away from catechism students to get them to pay attention in class. Now I have multiple communication streams to deal with. Now I carry my mobile office in my pocket. I am at church for programs and activities, but usually I have to go where the people are. I don't keep regular office hours any more. My cell phone's calls drop. The Internet goes down. My words are lost in cyber space. And yet, I use words more than ever. I speak, talk, and reflect on **God's Word** all the time. I wish that Pastor Bonhoeffer had mentioned the place of **God's Word** in the whole scheme of word "usage". Our use of words is not to be taken lightly. Our respect for **God's Word** and its primacy in our lives is critical to our growth in life and in faith. One thing that is still the same (and always will be) is that when we gather together for worship each week at Zion's Lutheran Church, **God's Word** is central, significant and saving. When we read, speak, and reflect on, **God's Word**, God's Holy Spirit comes to us in rich, full, life-giving, and life-saving ways. **You are mature enough in your faith to be there when we do this, right?** 

At the end of this month, on Sunday October 29, we will celebrate with 75 million Lutheran Christians worldwide, the inspiring, saving grace of the **Word of God.** 500 years ago that living Word zapped a German monk named Martin as he poured over the ancient texts in Greek, Hebrew and Latin. The Holy Spirit gave him "An Idea that Changed the World". Come and see how at The Hamburg Strand on Tuesday, October 24, at 7 p.m. The movie is free. Popcorn and soda are extra. Thank you to Thrivent Financial for sponsoring this showing. I hope to see you there.

#### **A DIFFERENT POINT OF VIEW**

One of the concepts that was emphasized during V.B.S. and the REFORMATION WALK was that God has a distinct purpose for each person's life, just as He did for that of Martin Luther!

Martin agonized over his unworthiness and sinfulness to the extent that he spent large amounts of time depriving his physical needs, flogging himself, and crying out to God for mercy and forgiveness. He deeply searched and studied the Scriptures for every detail he could find related to sin, punishment, and forgiveness. While the Bible clearly said that man must confess and repent, he also learned that Jesus paid the punishment due us in FULL!

The Roman Catholic Church taught and <u>still</u> teaches that when one dies their soul goes to *PURGATORY*. This is a place of fire and extreme punishment for our repented sins; to cleanse and prepare us for God's holy presence in Heaven. It is based on the Old Testament book of *MACABEES* 12:41-46. (If you don't recognize this book, it is because it is not part of the Protestant Canon!)

The Pope and the church expounded on Purgatory and the value of *INDULGENCES* in the Council of Florence-1439 and again in the Council of Trent-1563. Indulgences are the purchase by a living person of time off / completed for a person in Purgatory. It can be prayers for the dead, masses said dedicated to a deceased person, or the **Spiritual Merits** purchased for the dead.

#### Luther's 95 THESES, posted October 31, 1517,

were a challenge to debate these concepts with the prayer to impugn and debunk the un-scriptural ideas of indulgences. He wanted to reform the church, not to start a new church.

Today, the Protestant churches, namely our Lutheran church, measure our faith and ritual by Scripture alone. We do not believe in certain books of the Catholic Bible, Purgatory, Spiritual Merits, praying for the dead, nor Indulgences.

#### **Labyrinth Update**

The really great news is church council approved the project to build the labyrinth at Zion's Lutheran church. Joey Dalton, his project to earn his Eagle Scout status, presented the drawing of the labyrinth with a proposed budget and specific details about the building supplies, etc.

He is fortunate to have a retired Scout Master, with expertise in hardscaping (the laying of the bricks in a nice pattern), that has the necessary equipment, skid-steer (to remove the top soil), dump trucks (to haul top soil away), a compactor (to compact the stone) and he will provide his labor to help direct the building of the labyrinth.

The labyrinth will be moved several feet toward the garden to provide more privacy for the neighbor and the walkers of the labyrinth. Joey will stake that area out in the near future.

Construction is scheduled to begin on Sat., Sept. 30<sup>th</sup> and continue the next weekend of Sat., Oct., 7<sup>th</sup> through Mon., Oct. 9<sup>th</sup>. So, please everyone "pray" for clear, sunny skies!

By the time you read this article, the fundraiser of purchasing engraved bricks will begin. We'll have a sample of an engraved brick for you to view in 4 to 6 weeks. Bricks will cost \$100.00 each and can be in honor of or in memory of loved ones, including pets, specials times in your life, a favorite author, a famous person, or just your name to show your support of this project. Enclosed is the "Brick Engraving Order Form". Please consider sponsoring a brick and walking the labyrinth when it's completed!

#### **Council Corner September 2017**

A presentation was made by Joey Dalton, a member of Zion's Boy Scout Troop 163 who is working on his service project for his Eagle rank. Joey is planning and constructing phase 1 of the labyrinth which will be located west of the parking lot. After a presentation on estimated costs, materials, and location, Council approved moving into the construction phase set for October.

The meeting was attended by Pastor Mary Gade, assistant to our Synod's bishop, to check in with how our ministry is doing at Zion's. Council members listed positive aspects of our ministry including: the forming of the Congregational Care Team, the Sunday School Luther Walk, the Labyrinth, an active seniors group, the flood bucket project, and the faith at the movies program. Areas for growth included developing strategies to increase youth involvement and the establishment of a mutual ministry committee to act as a liaison between the pastor and the congregation.

This would improve communication and help the church's ministry progress.

Council discussed using some memorial fund money to upgrade the Church's use of technology – media in our ministry. This could include items like the sound system, projection TV, large screens, audio-visual equipment for Sunday School, etc. A request for people interested in this topic will be put to the congregation, and a committee will be formed to assess the needs and make recommendations for equipment and funding options.

Council also approved having the stained-glass window repaired, including the broken window vent. The wedding policy is being reviewed and updated. Council agreed to conduct a retreat to focus on goal setting for our congregational ministry. The meeting was closed with the Lord's Prayer.

# Zion's Lutheran Church is having a Reformation 500 Bookstore!




We will place our order by Sunday, October 22 so that we will receive the books here at the church just in time for the October 29<sup>th</sup> celebration of the Reformation!

#### **Labyrinth Buy a Brick Engraving Form**

Following the positive show of support at the annual meeting, Zion's Labyrinth Committee has been working hard to figure out the details of the labyrinth. In 2016, Hamburg High School Senior Trevor Fegley helped the congregation learn about Labyrinths and talk about where one might be located on the church property. This spring, Hamburg High School Senior Joseph Dalton decided that the Labyrinth would be his Eagle Scout project. Joey will be able to utilize the support of his friends in Zion's Troop #163. **On Tuesday, September 12, the Zion's Congregation Council approved the project's First Phase construction in October.** So, here are some details from the Labyrinth Committee: 1. The site is west of the parking lot just to the left of the light pole. The ground is already level, so there will be minimum digging. 2. Glen Gery bricks will be used to line the walkway. COCO, 2 3/4 inch brick pavers will be used. 3. The engravings will be 3 lines with no graphics. 4. Purchasing engraved bricks will be the one way that Zion's members and friends can support the project with their financial gifts. 5. Brick donors should use a Special Offering Envelope and mark it "Labyrinth Project" and include the engraving inscription below.

Join the project and purchase an engraved brick. Each inscription may contain a maximum of three lines of text, with each line comprised of up to 15 characters each. Characters, for the purpose of determining inscription length, include all letters, punctuation, and spaces. Bricks are \$100 each. You may purchase as many bricks as you like – please copy this form to indicate purchase of multiple bricks for placement together. The placement of the engraved bricks in the Labyrinth will be determined by the consensus of the committee. 
