Holy Week 2018

Dear Zion Friends,

Lent started on Valentine's Day this year. As we have reviewed 5 biblical covenants over the past 5 Sundays, we have talked a lot about God's unfailing love. Human love fails but God's love does not. Of course, we always talk about love at church. God's love for all of his people is a love story that has no ending. Please note that word "all" applies to every human being on this planet. No human set boundary can exclude anyone from that love.

During the coming Great and Holy Week, as a congregation we will again retell the "Greatest Love Story Ever Told". That story includes triumph, tragedy, betrayal, violence, agony, sorrow with a very shocking, earth-shattering surprise at the end of it.

We will celebrate The Resurrection of Our Lord on April Fool's Day, April 1. Tricks can, indeed, be scary things. As this year in particular, God plays a really good one on the forces of darkness, death and devil. The powerful army of Rome thinks that they have eliminated a treasonous revolutionary. The Scribes and Pharisees who stirred up the crowd to yell "Crucify, Crucify him" are smug because they think that they have succeeded. In one account, they even tried to post guards at the grave. When the guards fell asleep, they were bribed to say that the body was stolen. In Mark's story, even after an angel tells the women that "Jesus was raised, he is not here", they don't believe it. They ran away from the tomb "for terror and amazement had seized them; and they said nothing to anyone, for they were afraid." **They didn't get the joke!** It took them awhile to figure it out. They still needed his help. They needed a measure of his loving spirit.

All of these years later, we get the joke, don't we? When students have to run away from their school building or people run from a concert in fear, we know that we human beings need God. When pedestrian walkways fall on cars and crush people, we can see that our human ways are fallible and lead to death. When hurricanes destroy homes and lives, and people who are not sympathetic and far away fail to act to help, we could see our human sin. Accidents. Thirst. Different-ness. Greed. Apathy. Cancer. Addiction. Gender violence. Impatience. Tragedies. Self-centeredness. Hatred. Loneliness. Isolation. Crime. Cruelty. Hunger. I could go on and on about the human behaviors that are sinful. **That's where the joke comes in!**

The God of Heaven and Earth, the God who created all things, yes, that God, silences all of that sin with a loving action. In the biggest reversal of all time, God turns the tables. They expected death. They got life. They expected condemnation and punishment. They were forgiven. They expected more power, more control, more obedience. Instead they received grace upon grace. They saw that their ways were wrong and led to death. They saw that way of God led them to life, and hope and salvation. **That's why we are still talking about it today!**

We kneel to confess, we receive absolution. We kneel around a table and put out our hands to receive bread and wine. We will gather in a church, dark at first. Then the light will come and we will celebrate the welcoming, lifegiving splash of water that brings forgiveness and eternal life. We sing praises to the God of All Seasons who has the last word on the forecast for the day. New life has come! Embrace it! Join us for the celebration! Thanks be to our God! I am Pastor Bruce


