Dear Zion Friends in the Faith,

The Fairgrounds Mall, where stock cars used to be raced, is about to close. The redevelopment of that property is being planned. The VF Outlet Center in Wyomissing is undergoing a transformation to mixed use space. The Bon Ton Department store is closing at the Berkshire Mall after many years as an anchor.

Near the church property, the bulldozers, earthmovers, and dump trucks are really moving the dirt around now. The promised earthen berm towards the rear of the church property is starting to take shape. The sound of construction vehicles is often heard on both sides of Zion's Church Road. What a collection of big machines there is, moving around all the time! I am told that in the long run, it will be safer to pull out and go south on Route 61, on the new Hamburg Logistics Boulevard. We will see.

In recent years, these changes were actively opposed by many here in Perry Township. The quiet, rural beauty of our nearby fields is giving way to urban sprawl and to the need for new and modern warehousing called "logistical centers". If you have purchased anything on the Internet, and had it delivered to your doorstep then you have contributed to this change in how traditional retailing is done.

The local physical landscape is changing. Even our church property will be changing with the planned-for addition of a fire detection system and the repair of the almost 50-year-old stained glass window. The Northern Berks Community Garden will grow vegetables again. The Labyrinth has created new prayer space and saved some grass mowing time. All of this raises the question, will the people who make up our congregation change and adapt with it? Some people want their church to stay the same. This thinking, while possible can also be deadly. If one fails to change, one might become "petrified" and frozen in place. Dead. Change can make you nervous, that is for sure. Change can cause anxiety because of the unknowns. Adapting is the only alternative that leads to survival and life. This is true for congregations and for individuals.

Your medical diagnosis, the loss of a job or a loved one, the need to improve and get stronger, the desire to seek and find new more efficient ways, all of these and more might contribute to personal lifestyle changes. In what ways does our congregation need to adapt to survive?

Someone smart said that "the only thing constant is change." (I won't even get into the weather as a subject of conversation. This spring/winter/spring weather not withstanding!) Thankfully, God's love never changes. God's grace and forgiveness are a constant that we as believers can always rely on. After Jesus died, the disciples were scattered and leaderless. Those disciples, those first followers of The Way, discovered the power of the Holy Spirit on that first Pentecost Day. 3,000 were baptized on the birthday of "The Church of Jesus Christ". We rely on that same hope and those same promises even now.

On Sunday, May 20 we celebrate the Day of Pentecost, 50 days after Jesus rose from the dead. May God's love continue to empower us in the midst of so much change. PB
