Letter from the Pastor:



"The harvest is plentiful but the laborers are few" (Luke 10:2a)

Jesus appoints 70 individuals and sends them out in pairs ahead of him to every town and place where he himself intended to go. These people were Jesus' advance party sent to check out the community and soften up the crowd for his arrival.

Jesus gives them advice to travel light and accept hospitality whenever they receive it. When they are not welcomed, they should just move on. They must have had success because Luke reports in 10:17 that "**they returned with joy**". Jesus has been empowering people in their faith ever since those days long ago when he sent his followers out ahead of him. Jesus needed their help. Jesus couldn't do it without them. Jesus needed them to be his hands and feet, his eyes and ears in the world.

As the baptized children of God, we are called and sent out by Jesus to make a difference in our world today. Hopefully, we do that each day in our daily lives. When we gather for worship in the presence of God we share our joy in what we have done that has given God glory. The beloved community of Jesus Christ has long been tasked with the job of "softening up humanity", trying to prepare the world's people for the return of Jesus. Where there is poverty and suffering, we work to relieve it. Where there is injustice we work to correct it. Where there is hatred, we look to love. Where there is apathy, we use involvement. Where there is a need, we try to fill it. Where there is brokenness, we strive to practice forgiveness. Where people are homeless, we provide shelter.

You know how to do these things because many of you do these things every day.

On November 11-18th, Zion will once again host families in our community who are in transition in their lives. They need some hospitality shown to them while they get back on their feet. Our building provides safe space for them at night. Please consider providing an evening meal (about 6:30 p.m.) or sleeping overnight (from 8 p.m. to 6 a.m.) or providing breakfast items or helping setup-Sun. Nov. 11/pack up the cots-Sun. Nov. 18. as we use our building space to house some of God's beloved children. We are patiently waiting on our second planting. It's coming around slowly. Our first crop of cabbage, squash, onions, tomatoes, peppers, zucchini and beans amounted to 3881 lbs. We have delivered produce locally to the Hamburg Salvation Army, Hamburg Food Pantry, Schuylkill Valley Food Pantry, Keystone Military Pantry, Wyndcliffe Apartments and Friends Inc. Check our church bulletin for work nights and times.

Council Corner

Zion's Church Council met September 11, 2018. Lucille Gough, our Vice President, presided over the meeting. It was announced that there will be a Committee Heads meeting on November 5, 2018.

Transfers from Zion's were discussed as three people recently transferred from Zion's to St. John's in Sinking Spring.

Treasurer Sandra Moroney reported that we finished August 2018 \$9,386.24 in the red, and informed us that all committee budgets must be turned in by the end of September. Vacation Bible School collected a total of \$220.00 for Camp Noah. WELCA contributed \$2,000.00 to the newly installed fire detection system.

Harley Ludy, our puppeteer, has requested funds to build a stage he can use to do his performances here at Zion's. He believes \$75.00 will be sufficient. \$50.00 was raised by a puppet ministry collection and \$25.00 will come out of a memorial fund.

Correspondence was addressed and recommendations given for replies. It was agreed upon that mid-year giving statements will be closely monitored so that only current adult members will receive them.

Pastor Bruce reported that 6 couples attended the Memory Cafe in August, a free support group for Alzheimer's disease sufferers and their caregivers held here at Zion's monthly. Council approved the new Wedding policy booklets, which are almost ready to be printed. The status of the Congregational Care Team was discussed as we are down to 4 members and the pastor. Pastor Bruce has reached out to Cathy Schaeffer, the CCT trainer at the retreat last fall, for advice on how to proceed. Church council voted to donate \$500.00 from our emergency fund to Salvation Army for flood relief, and also voted to send a check to our flood victim member for \$170.00, which was collected through a special donation.



Council requested that Luke Mengel attend our next council meeting to discuss and answer questions about a proposed Eagle Scout project of building covered benches on our church property.

John Smith has agreed to help with the upkeep of Zion's website and we are still looking for someone to help with our Facebook page. We are also still looking for a coordinator for Family Promise which will be here the week of November 11th. Pastor Bruce has volunteered to be the coordinator if no one else comes forward.

The Council executive board and two other church members met with the psychologist chosen by the Bishop Advisory Board on Monday, September 10th. He will be reporting back to the Bishop and making recommendations.

A home school group of 5 adults and up to 15 children requested the use of our fellowship hall every Tuesday morning and had been given a temporary contract. Council voted to extend the contract through October, but requested a donation be given to help defray utility expenses. We will reevaluate the contract at that time.


