#### **Letter from the Pastor:**

#### Dear Zion members and friends,

When I was in college, I worked in **The Stop and Shop Grocery Store** in West Caldwell, NJ. I grew tired of working nights and weekends so I decided to begin delivering the **Newark Star-Ledger** newspaper, 4:30 a.m. to 7 a.m. each morning. It was a motor route with about 200 papers to deliver seven days a week. The pay was better than the store. The hours didn't conflict with anything but sleep. Sometimes I would come home and go back to sleep.

On more than one weekday morning, I failed to rise with my alarm clock. When my father got up for work and discovered that I was still in bed, he would come to my bedroom door and exclaim in a loud voice, "Aren't you going to deliver the papers today?" It felt like an electric shock had just gone through my body! I sprung out of bed and ran out the door. I'm sure that my dad enjoyed the sight! Customers didn't like it when their morning paper was late! That "electric shock" just might be how it felt to the disciples when they encountered the Risen Lord! Until Jesus ascended into heaven 40 days later, his followers had frequent encounters with him, on the road, by the sea, and in a large gathering.

Back in my early morning newspaper delivery days, when I would come home and lay back down, somewhere around 9 or 10 on the weekends, my dad would awaken me with the phrase "The world awaits; you, too, can make a valuable contribution!" Dad wasn't much for sleeping in, even on the weekends. I get my seemingly endless energy from him.

That phrase "the world awaits; you, too, can make a valuable contribution" is what the Risen Lord says to all of the baptized in every age. Sharing our gifts, talents, and resources with others is how we put our faith to work in the world. Each person has been given gifts that can be shared to help build up God's Kingdom here on earth. As individuals, we serve God in our daily lives. As a community of believers, we combine our gifts to do even more. Easter is not just a one-day celebration of the coming of spring, it is a seven-week season of joy. Some would say that its' joy extends to every worship service of the year.

I was in worship in our home congregation more often then, when I was a kid, then I am now as a pastor. I have four Sundays of vacation time now. As a young person, we rarely missed being in church four Sundays a year. My dad was not a pastor but we were faithful weekly attenders, even front row sitters in our small church building in north Jersey.

As you get out and about in the warm month of May, remember that it is the Risen Christ who bids you to do good, practice kindness and compassion toward others, and live out your days as a faithful baptized Child of God. I hope to see you in worship. In Christ, Pastor Bruce

#### Celebrating 50 years!

#### The Bricks



Where did the bricks come from for our building? If you said Glen-Gery, you'd be correct. If you said Glen-Gery Shoemakersville, you'd be incorrect. Our bricks came from the Reading plant in Wyomissing. Carl Hepner, Zion's member, was Plant Manager/Superintendent of Glen-Gery Reading division at that time. The bricks were extruded, cut by wire with a machine, and then burned in a kiln for at least 2 days. The kiln looked like a beehive. Local shale, dug up close by, was ground up fine to manufacture the brick, and the face of the brick was most likely blasted with sand to obtain the desired look and color. It was a labor-intensive process. According to Reading Eagle's Business Weekly (April 16, 2019), at nearly 130 years in business, Glen-Gery continues as one of the nation's largest brick manufacturers.

### **Church Reports**

There are several projects that are in progress or have been completed at the church. The floors have been replaced in the three bathrooms. The men's room floor was paid for out of the capital budget at approximately \$2,400. The women's room floors were paid for by WELCA. The women donated approximately \$5,000 to complete the project. Thank you WELCA for your contributions.

The water did not pass inspection. It was tested at the well, and is clean, but when it comes thru the pipes, it is testing positive for bacteria. Property has received an estimate to add a UV light to the system. The paperwork has been started, and a plumber has been contacted. This could be approximately \$3,500 to fix the issues. The parking lot needs to be replaced. Property received several estimates, and made a recommendation to council to go with Ronnie Folk Paving. They have a milling machine, so they can recycle the product. The entire parking lot, both front and back will be replaced for \$60,230.00. To secure the estimate, a deposit was made of 1/3 down in the amount of \$20,276.66. The down payment was taken from the Capital fund \$8,204.66 and \$11,872.00 was used from the Bill Hill memorial fund.

There are envelopes available for CAPITAL FUND. We ask that you prayerfully consider donating toward the projects. There is a balance for the parking lot of \$40,153.34 that will be due within 30 days of the project completion.

Please see any member of council if you have any questions. Thank you to everyone for all that you do for Zion's Lutheran Church.

#### COUNCIL CORNER

Our Church Congregation Council met on April 9, 2019, called to order by President Hoherchak.

Treasurer Sandra Moroney reported that we finished March with a deficit of \$905.25, making our total deficit for the year - \$25,062.49.

Council reviewed plans for Easter service coverage, the egg hunt, and the Easter breakfast.

A letter, drafted by Property Committee and signed by President Hoherchak on behalf of Council has been sent to Kistler O'Brien requesting that our warranty for the fire detection system be extended since there have been ongoing issues with the system since installation. To date there has been no response.

Worship & Music Committee reported that the request to soften the volume of the organ at the 8AM service has been implemented.

WELCA reported that after hearing a presentation about the Nurse Family Partnership, the group has decided that our Christmas in July drive will be collecting items needed by the group. A list of needed items and details on the project will be coming soon.

Luke Mengel's Eagle Scout project is underway and should be completed in time for our church picnic on June 2, 2019.

Personnel Committee presented a Paid Staff Supervisory Flow Chart which was approved by Council.

Media Planning reported that to provide coverage throughout the entire church, a second Wi-Fi network has been added for the Sunday School area.

Council approved entering into a contract with Ronnie Folk to repave our entire parking lot, at a total cost of \$62,200. A down payment of \$20,067 will be made from whatever Capital Funds are available, with the remainder from Bill Hill funds. The balance will be due 30 days after completion of

the project and will be made with any available Capital Funds and a loan from our Van Guard account which will be repaid. Respectfully submitted, Lucille D. Gough




