#### **Dear Zion Members and Friends,**

**November was a big food month.** The agricultural bounty of our county shows forth in the amazing meals that we enjoy. Did anyone consume "too much" on our National Day of Thanksgiving? Any now all of the holiday treats are available.

Food is such a huge part of church life. In the days leading up to our annual Bazaar, the cookie bakers used the church ovens to create wonderful treats. The church building smelled great all that week. That Tuesday, some homeschool children were wide-eyed and ready when I offered them some chocolate chip cookies at the end of their day's activities. Event #3 – 46 people enjoyed the soup buffet in the Fellowship Hall following Ministerium worship on Thursday morning, Nov. 21. Event #4 - Festival of Faith participants enjoyed shepherd's pie made by Zion WELCA volunteers and served at Bern Lutheran Church for supper on November 21. Event #5 – What a nice anniversary dinner we enjoyed on Saturday, November 23, provided by Dori Martin catering. What a beautiful job the Anniversary Committee did in decorating the Fellowship Hall and arranging the evening program. Thank you to Rita Decker, Shirlene Epting, Carolyn Hollenbach, Eileen Puglia, Carol Rothermel, Barbara Seidel, and Ruth Wilhelm for their good work in helping us celebrate and remember what happened 50 years ago and what has happened since, in this functional building that is the base of our operations as a faith community.

Our table fellowship is rooted in and finds its' deepest meaning in the sacred meal that we share around the altar when we gather for worship. 50 years ago, member Donald Smith knew this. The marble had not arrived. Folks were anxious to "try" the room out. Donald took it upon himself to construct a temporary table for use for that first worship service in the nave.

We continue to gather around the God's Table of Grace each week. In it, we find forgiveness of our sins and the hope of eternal life. We find strength for each day. We connect to our God who has acted to save us from ourselves. God came down to earth to check it out. God sent the Messiah to be born. This Advent season, we wait, once again, for him.


