Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Throughout this past year we have followed the guidelines for safe worship, especially since we opened the sanctuary in November for weekly worship, albeit one Sunday worship only. We are so thankful for members who take seriously the social distancing and mask recommendations that have allowed us to continue to hold worship inside! That is what has allowed us to plan for Holy Week and Easter services, understanding that we have adequate time to properly ventilate the sanctuary between gatherings and plan for meaningful worship.

As many are aware, we have lost members in death over the past year, the pandemic initially placing a hold on in-house funerals and memorials services. We simply do not have the person-power or the means to adequately sanitize the building!

But with the prospect of more of us actually receiving a vaccine and the apparent decline *(up to this writing)* of local cases, we are hopeful that we can have the sanctuary more available for gathering. We know that some churches in the area have been more "open", and that may be due to resources available to them that we do not have—we certainly hope it is not because they were willing to put people at risk because of disbelief of the seriousness of the pandemic! The numbers of hospitalizations and deaths, even in our area, are staggering, and to think it couldn't happen here...well, Zion's is simply not willing to put members at risk! There are several congregations that have not been able to have in-house worship for over a year, so we are clearly blessed!

With many of us being vaccinated (hooray!), and observing the overall community response to seeking vaccination, we are opening the sanctuary to limited-attendance funeral and memorial services – the same seating and mask requirements that continue to be in place for worship. Based on what we have observed in the community over the past several months, we feel we can do this with confidence. Local funeral directors have been diligent, as well, in their care for grieving families, and we feel we can open the sanctuary at this time based on what we have experienced in recent months.

I am hopeful, as well, that we may resume special events in worship, such as baptisms (several parents agreed that they wanted to wait until it seems safer to be in close contact for this holy rite). With so many of us "of a certain age" and with the compliance of so many of Zion's members, we believe we can see the light at the end of the tunnel! We long to be able to gather at the Lord's Table as we once did. At yet, we know that the pandemic is not over, so we must be vigilant and trusting God for discernment! We still need every one of us being diligent.

All this being said, we must always focus on what we are ultimately about as the Church: **sharing the good news of the Risen Christ to all who have ears to hear**. The disciples originally chosen by Jesus were not perfect, as you may have understood from the weekly devotionals posted on the church's Facebook page (they are available in printed form in the Narthex or by contacting the Church Office). Every disciple chosen by Jesus is relatable to our own personal experience.

We hope that you will find the services of Holy Week and Easter meaningful and encouraging for you own personal growth in faith. You may not have made Holy Week a priority in the past, but think about what Jesus thinks when he does what he does for you in his crucifixion, death, and resurrection...JUST FOR <u>YOU</u>!

Jesus calls and counts on each one of us to get the message and pass it on. Apostolic action is now on us!

Christ is Risen! He is Risen, indeed. Alleluia!

Council Corner

Devotions were from "Lasting Hope: Devotions for Lent by Susan Lutz

We finished February in the black but we still owe Vanguard \$30,000 in repayment.

We signed a new contract for Allen Organ Company to service our organ for the next year at a cost of \$980.00. Don asked Council to look into purchasing a baby grand piano. Council is recommending we seek for 3-4 months a possibility of someone willing to donate one to the church for FREE. We realize we must be patient in this endeavor and hopefully it will come to fruition. If none can be gotten then Don will have the authority to look for a used baby grand piano not to exceed \$10,000. Property will also need to look into the possibility of removing a pew for the placement of the piano up front. A baby grand will give us all kinds of possibilities for the future with recitals and concerts.

We also discussed and gave approval for funerals to be held in our sanctuary again and in the gold room, provided everyone practices the CDC guidelines of mask wearing and practicing social distancing.

Additional audio system items were purchased with memorial funds to enhance our live services on a Sunday.

As far as now there is no candidate who has applied to be a Pastor for our church.

We got a shocking estimate from PG Elite Lighting Service to repair our electrical system damaged by a lightning strike of \$12,180.00 but that isn't as high as it was expected to be. We are waiting to see if the insurance company will be paying that as we know we have a \$1,000.00 deductible. Thank goodness for insurance. **Financial Report** We finished February in the black \$245.44.

GUIDELINES FOR PLANTING AROUND TOMB STONES: EFFECTIVE MARCH 1 2021

- 1. No shrubbery or trees are permitted around tomb stones.
- 2. Small plants may be planted around tomb stones but must be cared for by the person who plants them.
- 3. Mulch is allowed around the plants.
- 4. There is a Spring Cleaning every spring in mid-March when all planters must be removed or planters will be removed by cemetery workers.
