Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

October brings us into the heart of fall, with our Harvest Home celebration on October 17th. We give thanks to God for the abundance of blessing we have with our grateful response of offering of food for the local food pantries and fall flowers at the altar.

But we also recognize two special Sundays in the church calendar: the first Sunday as World Communion Sunday and the last as Reformation Sunday. Both have very much to do with the sacrament of Holy Communion. Historically, the first Sunday has been a time for Christian congregations to come to the Lord's Table, regardless of their particular practice and understanding of the sacrament: it is about *unity*...oneness in our understanding of the goodness of God and the unconditional love in the work of Jesus Christ.

Reformation Sunday, on the other hand, is very much connected to the most significant movement in the Church (and the world) after its establishment on the Day of Pentecost. It is about *reforming our understanding of what Christ intended the church to be.*

We Lutheran Christians understand that Martin Luther and other prominent reformers of the 16th century lifted up the doctrine of *Justification by Grace through Faith*, based on scripture [Romans 3.24]. The reformers, especially Luther, spoke to the grossly incorrect teaching of the Church at the time that served to control the people and fill the coffers of the establishment.

One of the most significant arguments among the reformers concerned the Sacrament of Holy Communion, which is part and parcel of our Reformation Sunday worship (not to mention regular Sunday worship). Sunday was established as Christian worship by the eye witnesses to Christ' life, death, and resurrection; it included the holy meal because Jesus had told them to do it in remembrance of him...and it was absolutely about Jesus giving his body in sacrifice to save us and his blood to wash over us and cleanse us from sin. The Church has continued that through the ages, as Sunday worship is all about Christ's victory over sin and death. We Lutherans preach and teach about Christ's victory and make sure we offer the sacrament as the undeserved gift Jesus gave us to us as comfort for our souls.

Sunday worship, when Lutherans first started coming to the new world, included the holy meal only when there was an ordained pastor to preside; hence the practice of four to six times a year until there were enough pastors to serve congregations. Unfortunately, that fostered a still poor understanding of the meal as an essential element of Sunday worship. What sets Christians apart from other religions is that God came to us in human form and became the only sacrifice that could spare us from eternal condemnation and the grave. For that reason, we treasure the opportunity for the weekly reminder that gives us hope and strength yet in this life.

As our spring study came to a close, the request came for a study on other religions, that we might better understand our neighbors' faith and strive for the peace that we long for. In late October we'll have another weekly study, based on the book **Families of Faith:** *An Introduction to World Religions for Christians via* ZOOM, to make it possible for as many to participate as possible. We'll offer Wednesday mornings and evenings again for all who are able to attend. Below is an order form for a book which will be the basis for our study and reflection. You may order a book even if you are not able to join the discussion. **Orders are needed by October 12.**

We don't have to be good enough, old enough, or knowledgeable enough to receive God's blessing and be served at the Lord's Table!

If you're wondering if your young child might be ready to receive the Sacrament, please talk with Pastor about bringing your child for a time of preparation (3 sessions, flexible scheduling), that they may receive Holy Communion with you for the first time on Reformation Sunday, Oct. 31 (All Saints Sunday, Nov. 7, if Reformation cannot work for your family—or yet another Sunday).


