- We still owe \$15,000 to ourselves (VanGuard account) for the parking lot
- Annual Meeting date was set for January 23 with a snow date of January 30
- The overwhelming majority of church attendees are vaccinated
- It has been recommended to not have a Thanksgiving Eve service this year, but we are hoping to have in-person Christmas Eve services
- WELCA is going to pay for the new carpet in the Gold Room
- The AED has new pads and batteries and the fire extinguishers have been inspected and are up to code
- Active Shooter presentation by Trooper Boehm on October 14
- Angel Tree will be having tags in the traditional format look for them in November
- The sound system was evaluated and the entire system is obsolete. We are waiting on a price to replace the entire system. Full replacement will take 6 months to a year because of supply issues. The company can set us up with a loaner digital processor that will improve the current system until the new one is installed. Replacing the sound system is a priority of the council.


