Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

At the Annual Meeting in January, I shared that I had gotten an interesting insight from having cataract surgery in January, providing an object lesson for the church to consider.

After the first eye was done, I noticed an immediate improvement, both in distance and in close-up vision. My glasses were of no use now with my eyes seeing on different planes. I was excited to drive without glasses, with anticipation of acquiring cool sunglasses after years of unexciting prescription sunglasses or clip-on shades. Maybe I could now buy some "Jackie O" sunglasses, different sizes, different styles!

Then came the realization that I could actually read without my blended-lens bifocals. I couldn't wait to see what difference the second eye surgery would make. In the meantime, I splurged and bought a \$1 pair of readers to ease the strain of the yet untreated eye, until my vision could be tested after the eyes had both healed. Maybe I would only need readers...

But the other big realization was that my aging clouded lenses had also cast a *false color* on everything I saw: the kitchen counter, the stainless-steel sink, the wintered grass out in the yard, the red tablecloth I had used for the holidays—and even my hair! Closing the treated eye and looking thru the untreated eye made it quite apparent to me that I had not been seeing the real color for a really long time!

Now to the hope of calling a new pastor. The lens we look through is critical! We cannot afford to look through old discolored lenses for a realistic vision of the present and the future.

Before COVID hit, the expectation was that it would be just a matter of calling a new pastor, as done in the past. COVID jolted churches into the necessity of revisioning. That means looking at the stark reality of what the congregation is willing to do to move ahead. The congregation's vision must be realistic in order to thrive and remain healthy.

- Calling a fulltime pastor can happen only if the congregation is willing to make it happen through *revisioned stewardship* of personal resources to provide adequate compensation.
- Calling a part-time pastor might mean sharing a pastor with another congregation or the pastor having to seek employment somewhere to meet family/household needs. It also means the pastor has less flexibility of time and availability.
- In the case of sharing a pastor with another congregation, the congregations must both be aware that there is the additional challenge for the pastor in working with different histories and traditions, different procedures and practices, different personalities in leadership positions. It also means adjusting worship and meeting schedules.
- Calling a pastor at any level means that *every member* must be committed to the ministry and mission of the congregation, using the gifts and talents and the time God has provided to each person to make things happen. The pastor is the shepherd; it is the sheep who produce the wool. [Read 1 Corinthians 12.12-21]

As Transition Pastor, my role has always been to help and guide you through a *revisioning process*. It means, however, everyone being open to giving up the old clouded and discolored lens in favor of a clear(er) lens for the immediate and future time. My cataract surgery has given me new insight into how exciting a revisioning process can be because of the outcome and prognosis for the future—even how I now see myself in the mirror and how others see me.

The newly-elected Council, the ministry-area committees, the Altar Guild, and all serving members, will count on increasing every-member support and commitment to continue Zion's mission in the community and to attract a new pastor to shepherd the flock. Eyes and minds must open to what God wants Zion's to bring into focus.

How bright and hopeful a new vision can be!

Council Corner

Church Council met on January 11, 2022. The Treasurer reported that for December we had \$9,765 surplus of Income over Expenses. However, we completed the year with a \$4,611.57 deficit, with Expenses being greater than Income. We also need \$9,328.29 in donations to the Capital Fund to cover the costs for the work completed on the parking lot last year.

The Call Committee will be meeting with Rachel Dietz, Associate to the Bishop on January 17 to review our site survey. Worship and Music Committee reported that our sound system may be completed by the end of the month. WELCA will be providing funding for our confirmands to attend a church camp retreat. Nominating Committee reported that they are seeking 4 people for a 3-year term on Council and 2 people for 2-year terms. Anyone interested in serving on Council can contact the church office, or any member of Council.

As a public building, we are required to test our water periodically. Unfortunately, we were 2 days late in testing – testing was completed as soon as this error was realized. The test results were fine. However, if you happened to come to the church and see a notice about the water, that was the reason.

Next Church Council meeting will be February 8,2022. If anyone has any concerns or business for Council, please speak with Council President, Tiffany Gruber or any member of Council.

We finished the month of December at \$9,765.68 in the black. (monthly income over expenses). Overall, for the year, at the end of December we were \$4,611.57 in the red, a significant improvement from the \$28,784.44 deficit carried into January 2021.

We continue to see Capital Improvement donations for the paving of the driveway and parking lot completed a few years ago. We are hoping to observe the payoff of the \$9,323.29 balance in the coming months.

ANNUAL MEETING UPDATES:

Council would like to thank Susan Lutz for her time on council. We would also like to thank John Smith, Mark Dreibelbis, and Faye Heckman for running again for another term on council. Carolyn Hollenbach was also elected to serve on council. Thank you to Eileen Puglia for having served on the nominating committee and to Kim Olsweski for having served on the auditing committee.

The council members for this upcoming year are Janine Dreibelbis, Mark Dreibelbis, Lucille Gough, Heather Gring, Samantha Gruber, Tiffany Gruber, Faye Heckman, Carolyn Hollenbach, Brian Moroney, and John Smith. A president, vice president, and secretary will be elected at the February 8, 2022, meeting. If you are interested in serving on council and would like to serve on a one-year term, please reach out to anyone on council. We currently have two openings on council.

The newly elected audit committee person is Susan Lutz. The newly elected nominating committee person is Brian Moroney. We still have one spot to fill on the nominating committee, if you are interested in serving on this committee, that only meets one time per year, please see a council member.

The call committee reported at the meeting that our ministry site profile has gone live. We are now in a waiting position for a possible candidate. As we have mentioned in previous newsletters, many congregations in our synod are looking for a pastor with not as many candidates as in previous years. Please be patient and continue to look for updated information in our newsletters.

As was mentioned at the meeting, our budget that passed, was created without putting in a salary amount for a called pastor. As stated in the annual report, hiring a full-time pastor would cost us at least \$90,000 or more depending on their experience. This cost includes salary, housing allowance, employee benefits and mileage reimbursement. We, as a congregation, will be faced with the challenge of increasing our revenue by approximately \$4,600 per month in order to meet

the personnel and operating expenses of a full-time pastor.

We are also hoping that in 2022 we can pay off the outstanding amount for paving the driveway and parking lots. The amount we owe is just slightly under \$10,000. If you would like to contribute, please put your donation in an envelope marked capital fund.


