Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Another calendar year has begun for the planet we inhabit, bringing with it fresh hopes—as well as recurring hopes—for things to come.

With a more "normal" atmosphere and routine returning to Zion's, it is time to think again about the gifts and talents breathed into us in our baptism, especially as we remember the Baptism of Our Lord marking the start of Jesus' ministry and mission among us (this year, January 9). How awesome is it to contemplate that *each one of us* has been endowed with spiritual gifts in our baptism for building up the Body of Christ!

The gifts of the Spirit are listed in four places in scripture, for a total of over 20 different gifts: Romans 12.6-8, 1 Corinthians 12.4-11, 1 Corinthians 12.28, and Ephesians 4.11. Not all gifts are listed in each passage, just the ones the writer is emphasizing for the particular community at that time, so it's important to check all the passages.

How does one know which spiritual gifts one has?

Two reliable indications are (1) identifying what we have passion for doing, and (2) hearing what others tell us about how they experience God working through us in church and community.

This newsletter, as well as late December Sunday bulletins, has an insert of ministry opportunities in and through Zion's that can help get you started identifying, or maybe confirming, your spiritual gifts. What might you like to try? What has given you joy and/or satisfaction in the past? What are people *really* saying to you when they seek you out personally and invite you to join them in some essential area of ministry in the church?

Are spiritual gifts set in stone so that no one else can use them? No! There are times when God sees some particular pressing need and nudges someone to step up to fill that need that the essential ministry may continue. Sometimes our particular situation or health is altered by what life brings, and gifts that may have lain "dormant" come to the fore. It's truly exciting to see how God makes possibilities into reality when we just take a chance and trust the power of the Holy Spirit breathed into us in our baptism!

What happens when we sit back and decide we don't feel like using our spiritual gifts? I once was shopping for a bridal shower, with the list of needs & wants, colors & style in hand. I found the perfect guest towels with crocheted lace in the perfect color for the couples' intended powder room. After the wedding, I happened to visit and was pleased to see the towels in the powder room, so I used one. Well, turns out the bride didn't want them used—they were to be just for show. Made me feel sad and a bit unwelcome, to be honest.

The Holy Spirit does not give gifts for show!...or to go unused! It grieves God to have grace through God's work in Jesus Christ taken lightly. Christ's mission among us was certainly not for show or to have no discernible purpose. His work in the cross is clear evidence that God means business! Jesus worked with seemingly unlikely souls to prepare them for apostolic action, and look what happened! Lest one among us might think that our gifts and talents are not as important or needed as the next person's, let us all think again.

The cross of Christ is marked upon you in your baptism. Jesus' words at the table where we are fed are "for *all* people"...the body and blood of Christ given and shed *for you*!

Christ is counting on us! On whom or what do we count?

Council Corner

Church Council met on Tues Dec 14th. Dan Brennan from the Finance Committee met with us to discuss next year's budget. Our income this year has been adequate to cover our expenses. As of the end of November our offerings have totaled \$160,877, and our expenses have been \$139,557. Zion's members have been faithful with their giving. Finance Committee did emphasize that our giving would not have been adequate to support a full time Pastor, and this will need to be a goal in the future.

Worship and Music reported that the new temporary speaker has been installed in the front of the church, and 2 smaller speakers in the back. The company reports that they will be able to complete the project once supplies are available, which could be into March or April of next year due to the current supply shortages.

Council thanked Pastor for her work in coordinating the Sunday School program at the Dec 12th church service. Our Sunday School teachers did a good job working with students from Nursery through High School to put on this meaningful program.

Pastor reported she had requested that Property Committee remove the front pew wall on the pulpit side so the piano could be placed there. This allows for better access in the front of the church during communion. It also provides more room for when the choir is singing up front.

The congregational meeting is set for January 23rd. Due to the ongoing Covid situation, we will have the meeting in the Nave immediately after church and no meal will be provided. There will be an option to participate by Zoom. More information will follow.

The Call Committee and Church Council will be planning to meet in January with Rachel Dietz, executive associate of the Bishop. We will be discussing our congregational site profile and our call for a Pastor.

Planning was completed for the Christmas Eve services which included Covid protocols, usher duties, communion and candle lighting procedures.

Next meeting is scheduled for Jan 11th. If anyone has any concerns or business for Council, you may speak to Council President, Tiffany Gruber or any Council member.

Financial Report

We finished the month of November at \$3,416.41 in the red (monthly income over expenses). Overall, for the year, at the end of November we were \$14,377.25 in the red, a significant improvement from the \$28,784.44 deficit carried into January 2021.

We continue to see Capital Improvement donations for the paving of the driveway and parking lot completed a few years ago. We are hoping to observe the payoff of the \$9,956 balance in the coming months.
