<u> Zíon's Messenger – March 2022</u>

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

It happens sometimes that a verse or passage of scripture "pops" off the page for me. It plays over and over in my mind, evidence that God wants me to pay attention to it.

It happened for me when I was preparing a sermon message for the 7th Sunday after the Epiphany. Luke's gospel relates what is called "the sermon on the plain" (with teachings similar to Matthew's "sermon on the mount"). It comes from the same passage that gives us what we call the Golden Rule ("Do to others as you would have them do to you." [Luke 6.31]).

The verse? "...give and it will be given to you...for the measure you give will be the measure you get back" [Luke 6.38a, c]. It brings to mind many life questions:

- What do I want from my spouse? I have to first listen to my spouse's needs, hopes, and fears in order to provide the loving support I need in return.
- What do I want from my children? I have to first show them genuine love and respect, and I must show them that I am truly working to meet their needs.
- What do I want from relationship with a friend? It means I have to <u>be</u> a friend first.
- What do I want from an employer? I have to show the employer my commitment and determination to do a good job.
- What do I want from an employee? I have to show the employee respect and make sure the employee has the "tools" needed to meet job expectations.
- How do I want to be treated where I shop? I have to first show respect for those who serve me and for the expectations of the business.

So, what is the message for Zion's? The health and vibrancy of any congregation is in the commitment of its members. It's about what you want to be available for you and what you will do to make it happen:

- It's about regular *participation* in worship.
- It's about daily prayer and devotional life (always an emphasis in the Season of Lent).
- It's about using gifts and talents to make ministry happen—serving in one or more of the five ministry areas: Worship, Learning, Service, Witness, Support.
- It's about financial support: giving "until it feels good" and making offering a priority, whether you are in worship every week or not.

At the annual meeting once again we talked about the prospect of calling a new pastor, with so many congregations seeking a new pastor and so few candidates on the horizon.

The question is "how important is it to the congregation to be able to call a pastor, and what will that position look like?" With committees working for effective ministry, with people stepping up to answer the call to leadership positions, with members coming forth to answer the call for more help in certain areas, Zion's has what it takes to attract a pastor!! The remaining hurdle is increasing offering to meet expenses and provide adequate compensation.

At the end of the week on average, how much is still in our personal kitty to make expenses? Could that amount be the blessing from God that could be given back to God for the ministry and mission of the congregation? Your Finance Committee has projected what is needed to be able to call a full-time pastor—see the proposal in the budget for the coming year. If every giving unit would make the commitment to increase weekly offering by even up to five dollars, the Call Committee could begin to interview a promising candidate—even a shared pastor—with confidence.

That verse comes back to mind: for the measure you give will be the measure you get back.

Council Corner

At the February 8th meeting, we held an election for officers for the upcoming year. Tiffany Gruber will continue as President, Mark Dreibelbis as Vice-President and John Smith as Secretary. It was also mentioned at the meeting that we forgot to include Irwin Levan's name on the committee list for the Endowment Committee. We apologize for this oversight and thank Irwin for serving on this committee. We would also like to thank Nancy Dresher for agreeing to join the Altar Guild Committee. They are still looking for another person or two who might be interested in helping with their committee.

The council also had a rather lengthy discussion regarding our Capital fund and some upcoming projects. In the budget that was passed at the annual meeting we have budgeted for \$10,000 for some upcoming property projects dealing with the pneumatic controls for our aging heating system. We also still have approximately \$9,200 that needs to be paid yet on the driveway project that was completed. If anyone is interested in making any donations towards the capital fund, please use an envelope found in the pews and make sure that it is marked for Capital fund.

At the annual meeting, it was discussed that our budget we passed did not take into account a salary for a pastor as we were not sure if we would be able to call a full-time pastor without an increase in giving's to the church or if we would need to look at a part-time pastor or even a shared ministry. The likelihood of someone looking for a part-time ministry is not great. The council has created a steering committee to pursue these various avenues and to determine what we at Zion's can feasibly afford with our current giving's. Please keep this committee in your prayers and prayerfully consider how you might be able to help Zion's during this time of transition. We welcomed Elaine Stone into our congregation on February 27th and welcome back Ron Seaman. We will also be hosting the local ministerium Lenten Soup/Bread Luncheon on Thursday, April 7th. A sign-up sheet has been posted on the bulletin board in the narthex for volunteers to donate soup, bread, or beverages. We are also looking for a volunteer who would be willing to provide devotions for this luncheon. Pastor Diane will gladly work with this person on the devotions. If you are interested in volunteering, please sign up on the sheet posted in the narthex.
