Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Christmas often brings memories of past Christmases for me: the year "Santa" brought me the doll I wanted with all my being; the year Dad bought Mom her desk and Mom bought Dad a new recliner—and neither one knew why there was so much money taken out of the Christmas account (and I was sworn to secrecy!); hearing stories from those who lived through the Great Depression being so grateful to receive an orange for Christmas; the years we spent Christmas with our children's grandparents and the first year we spent Christmas in our own home in WV so the kids would have that memory before we moved to PA; our grandson's first Christmas in our home finding the Mickey Mouse doll under our tree; the year I was grieving the fresh loss of my dad; the year my mom passed away on Christmas morning...

This time of the year is "supposed to be" joy-filled, and yet not every year is that "perfect" childhood notion of Christmas.

Gift-giving is stressful because we're often expected to address "wish lists" instead of just trying to find that meaningful gift that might bring joyous surprise to a loved one's eyes.

For the one who loves to bake, there's the day (or days) set aside for cookie baking, and nothing better get in the way!

There are all the appeals that come in the mail from charities, and the risk of giving, knowing that now you'll be on the charity's monthly mailing list!

Such is our American culture! (By the way, Christmas wasn't declared a federal holiday in this country until 1870.)

I've found Rick Steves' programs about Christmas customs in other countries to be quite refreshing...less "commercial" pressure and much more emphasis on family gathering around special meals and enjoying different local pageants.

Over the years I have not fully felt the "Christmas spirit" until the Christmas Eve candle lighting as we sing "Silent Night". That's when I can say I love Christmas!

An interesting piece of information is that the Church didn't incorporate Christmas as a festival in the liturgical calendar until around the 9th century! The early "legalized" Christian religion began to celebrate Christmas in Rome in the 4th century. As the Church was seeking to solidify its teaching about the faith, understanding the *Incarnation* (God putting on flesh and coming among us as Jesus) was critical to understanding that *this faith* was not like any other world religion, and that humanity had hope that no other religion offered.

The date of December 25th was identified as a set date (unlike other festivals in both the Jewish and Christian religion, which are not set annually). The date was intentionally set to draw focus away from a pagan festival. Jesus was probably actually born between 6 and 4 BC, the year estimated by astrological alignments, estimating the time of the beginning of Jesus' ministry, and comparing details with other historical events. As far as the time of the year is concerned, when shepherds might be grazing their sheep has made some scholars think winter might make sense, while others are not so sure.

What matters is that we have the festival in the liturgical calendar to emphasize the Incarnation. That God comes among us as a *human* child, growing into a *human* adult, experiencing death as a *human* (albeit at the hands of humans) is what gives us hope for eternal life, as Jesus opens that door for us by the resurrection.

May whatever else going on around you at Christmas be put out of mind, as we focus on God coming among us as *human*, birthed into this life as we are birthed, living as we live, with the victory over death and the grave accomplish by God in Christ, making Christmas something to truly celebrate!
