Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

New Year's resolutions...have you made any this year? How about in previous years? And how did that pan out? There are the usual resolutions: lose weight, exercise, eat healthier, put more in savings, take that dream vacation... There are others I sometimes hear from folks: read the Bible, pray more regularly, get back to church...

I have some myself: experiment more in the kitchen (try those recipes Rachael Ray does on her program), vacuum more often (now that I have a better vacuum cleaner), get serious about planning a major trip, reread my books in French that I collected as a student in France, reread some of my professional books... It's a bit risky sharing those things in writing!

So why do some resolutions work and others go by the wayside until another year?

It's the difference between being *intentional* and merely giving lip service. Some folks have given up making New Year's resolutions because they know they really have no intention on following through—they've learned that about themselves—they're being honest, at least, even knowing somewhere deep inside that there are things they need to do.

Let's be honest...making changes does take effort and energy. We may have effort and energy for things we really *want* to do, but for things we really *need* to do, it's often another story. We can't just sit back and expect things to happen or wait for someone else to make the difference. Making a resolution come to fruition does take *personal investment*.

This past fall Zion's returned to intentional focus on stewardship, sharing insights form members about how they've experience God's generosity in their lives or in the life of someone around them, and how they have responded in tangible ways with generosity. Many members resolved to be more intentional about supporting and growing the congregation's vital ministries.

Intentional stewardship of God's generosity to Zion's is what will make Zion's move ahead in the coming year. And it does take every member's resolve to respond to God's generosity, both with financial support and in sharing of ministry tasks within the four walls of Zion's and in outreach to where God calls us. It may well mean doing things differently.

The obvious and realistic need is to get to the place of being able to call a pastor, whether it is in a shared situation with another congregation or in a type of part-time situation (just a word about that: there is no evidence of pastors seeking part-time calls).

A shared situation would certainly require adjustments in the way participating congregations schedule worship, Bible study, events, pastoral visitation, meetings, office time, etc. There are several examples in the Northeastern PA Synod of shared ministry: same site, different buildings, sharing different ministry tasks, etc. Recently four Lutheran congregations in Reading came together, sharing two pastors as Co-Pastors of Renewed Spirit Lutheran Church (what an awesome name!), a process that came together over several years of conversation. My experience before serving at Zion's saw a Lutheran congregation and a UCC congregation who shared a cemetery coming together in an official shared ministry with one pastor, using both buildings for worship, study, meetings, and events, maintaining their names and their worship styles, but working together in many other facets of the ministry. What makes it work? Their resolve, their intention... and their trust in God!

This coming year needs the resolve of every member to transition into calling a pastor, in whatever configuration God provides. Transition time is not meant to be permanent or a time when everything gets put on hold. It is time to move ahead, to change as is necessary for vitality. Zion's leaders are committed to making that happen and depend on the resolve of the congregation to make it happen. And it is every bit about *putting trust in God* to make effort and energy *intentional* (lip service won't make anything happen!). Christ is counting on the people of Zion's...on whom are you counting?

Annual Meeting & Luncheon

We will need to have 50 people in attendance to make any motions and we will not be using Zoom this year for the meeting.

After the annual meeting, we will be holding the luncheon in the fellowship hall. The fellowship committee will be providing barbeque, hot dogs, and drinks. Please plan to bring a covered dish to share. We look forward to seeing everyone at the annual meeting!



Council Corner

Zion's Church Council met on December 13. Treasurer, Sandra Moroney reported that we are now \$17,000 in the black. In January of 2021, we were \$28,000 in the red. We have gradually been able to make up the deficit due to decreased expenses associated with a part-time Pastor, a few cost cutting measures, several generous donations, and the results of some increased giving due to the stewardship campaign. She also reported that we have now paid off the parking lot. Council would like to encourage members to continue to make donations toward the Capital campaign as we have the potential to have some large expenses in the near future relating to our heating system and our roof. We have also paid up our fuel bill through December. Fuel costs continue to rise so this will be a significant expense through the winter.

We continued to discuss our Pastoral vacancy and are looking at all the options that are available. The Call Committee is ready to look at any candidates that might be presented to us.

Council approved the purchase of an adjustable piano bench to go with our baby grand piano.

There was considerable discussion about security upgrades to our building particularly related to lights and security cameras. At present, we have added increased lighting to the back area of the parking lot and the police are patrolling the lot regularly.

Council reviewed the budget for 2023 and approved the proposed budget which will be presented to the congregation for the congregational meeting on January 22. It was also decided to have our congregational meeting this year without using Zoom. The meeting will be held in the church immediately after the service, and then we will dismiss to the fellowship hall for a covered dish meal.

Council responsibilities were reviewed for the Christmas Eve services. There was approval to receive the offering by passing the basket at both services as recommended by Worship and Music.

It was also reported that we are looking for someone to be responsible for providing updates and information about our church services to the local newspapers. Virginia Werley provided this service for many years, and we thank her for her work in this area.

If you have any concerns or suggestions for Council, you may discuss them with President, Tiffany Gruber; Vice President, Mark Dreibelbis; or any Council member.

Pastor Diane sends thanks for messages of Christmas blessings and to the Women of the ELCA for the gift to Lutheran Disaster Response Fund in her honor.


Redner's Save-A-Tape 2022 Collections
