<u> Zíon's Messenger – March 2023</u>

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

I look forward to hosting family and/or friends at our house for a meal. I take care in planning a meal that will make people feel loved and valued.

The other hospitality task I spend time on is setting the table. I'm a tablecloth-and-cloth-napkin person, with colors and patterns for every season or occasion. Candles and candlesticks are carefully chosen and placed, as is the centerpiece. And, of course, the dish patterns are chosen with the actual meal in mind. I want guests to feel valued and welcome, so setting a pretty table hopefully gets our meal together off to a good start.

Setting the table in the Lord's House for the holy meal is done with just as much care by the Altar Guild, in order to focus on the meal itself...and on the Host who has prepared it.

The cloth covering the table—the Fair Linen—is white, embroidered with a cross at each corner of the table surface, plus a slightly larger cross centered at the front edge of the table, marking the wounded hands and feet of the Crucified One and the larger wound made by the sword piercing Jesus' side. The purificators (napkins) may or may not also bear a cross. There are no flowers on the Lord's Table to distract from what is central to the meal. The vessels—ciborium (for supply of wafers), the paten (plate, if not a basket for bread), the flagon (pitcher), chalices (vessels for the wine), are the finest dishes…silver or pewter or finely-crafted pottery. Or they could just as well be simple every-day glass vessels!

On the altar, you will also see the chalice and paten covered with a veil or a pall. The first holy cover described and commanded by God was for the Ark of the Covenant (the vessel containing the tablets with the Ten Commandments). Traveling in the wilderness, the Israelites kept the Ark in the Tent of the Lord's Presence. So, many churches cover the vessels in some way as reminder of the "holy place" for the presence of God.

Attention to detail, including specific placement of items on the Lord's Table is done to call our focus to God's hospitality, welcoming the family to the holy meal.

The season of Lent draws our focus to the Lord's Table and the meal reminding us of the forgiveness poured out for us in the Body of Christ given for us, the Blood of Christ shed for us...the meal God goes to great lengths to prepare just for us! May this Lenten season bring you to experience the depth of God's hospitality.

FIRST COMMUNION

At the recent Christmas program, children were asking why some children communed and some did not, a good indication of readiness. We wouldn't invite friends to our home and only feed the adults...neither does God!! Baptism and Holy Communion are **Means of Grace—GIFTS** that *cannot be earned or deserved*—ways of helping ALL people, to know that God loves us unconditionally. We don't have to be good enough, old enough, or knowledgeable enough to receive God's blessing and be served at the Lord's Table!

Please talk with Pastor about bringing your child for a time of preparation (3 sessions, flexible scheduling), that they may receive Holy Communion with you. A form is available at Sunday School or in the Church Office.



Church Council met on Feb. 14. The meeting opened with devotions on God's love for us through his love for his son Jesus Christ.

Council members voted unanimously to keep the same council officers in the coming year: President, Tiffany Gruber; Vice President, Mark Dreibelbis; Secretary, John Smith; Treasurer, Sandra Moroney. Members signed up for their respective duties for devotions at council meeting and council corner reports.

The Treasurer's report showed we finished January 2023 in the black with a fuel bill of \$3160.00 owed to Francis L. Werley.

Vacation Bible School is scheduled for June 19-23 from 9:00 am to 11:30 am.

Sandra Moroney was appointed as liaison from Council to the Endowment Committee.

We discussed the three open council positions and urge members who are interested in serving on council to contact a council member or Pastor Diane. The joint Confirmation class will hold a retreat at Zion's on Sunday, February 19.




