### Zíon's Messenger - May 2023

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

In a recent Bible study session on the book of Ephesians, we were talking about the "construction" of the Church and what the church is intended by God to be. That sparked conversation about how Zion's designed and began construction of the congregation's current home.

Eileen Puglia reflected on a series of articles she had written for the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebration of the building, citing conversation with Ernie Heckman, who chaired the Building Committee. Ernie was adamant about the altar being the heart and primary focus of the overall design...this would be *God's house among us*, and everything else should depend on God's presence and purpose

Longtime members talked about watching the progress of the building, and Roberta Ott brought in photo albums from the church library for us to look over. It was exciting to understand how the building took shape. Memories were sparked about the time after worship on the hill when folks would come each week to see what had been accomplished. The careful and prayerful thought that went into the design and construction of this building has served the congregation well, to be sure.

Ephesians brings home the true purpose of the church when we talk about how we manage the ministry and mission of the congregation. We must always be aware that the Church is *beyond* a "human institution", not to be confused with other "organizations" in the community. In actuality, the Church is not about bricks and mortar, nor is it about a social club or service organization, although the building is not meant to be closed after Sunday worship until the following week, either. The return of the monthly Seniors group (3rd Thursday, 11am), the regular support of local food pantries and shelters, and the community garden are evidence of the congregation's care and outreach to meet needs of people. Ultimately, what we would do as a congregation must flow from worship and come back to worship for strengthening, as we strive to discern a right relationship with God in Christ.

On the Day of Pentecost, the remaining eleven original inner-circle disciples, plus the one chosen to fill the place left vacant (by Judas who, tragically, did not grasp the words Jesus spoke about God's forgiveness), were gathered in Jerusalem for the annual spring harvest festival. It was fifty days after the resurrection, God's time beyond human expectation. Peter, who had clearly been changed by the Risen Christ was preaching to the crowd when the Holy Spirit showered the people with the presence of God. Acts tells us that thousands of people came to new belief. There was "unity" of spirit among the people, and the Church was birthed (no walls there!).

Pentecost Sunday this year will be Confirmation for two young members, Gabby Leone and Taylor Gruber. We celebrate with Gabby and Taylor and their families, and as a congregation, the ministry of Confirmation, whose purpose is to strengthen faith and shape responsible church membership. May God continue to nurture us all, that we all may continue to grow in faith.

Church Council met on April 11<sup>th</sup>. The meeting opened with devotions on taking our attention off our troubles and instead focusing our hearts and minds on Jesus, having faith that He will help us in every time of need.

A review of the Treasurer's report showed that we finished March in an unfavorable position of \$(40.8k) YTD; however, income exceeded expenses by \$2.4k for the month.

We reviewed worship numbers for March, which surpassed prior year attendance by 31 worshipers. In addition, it was noted that Holy Week and Easter services this April were very well attended. It was nice to see a strong turnout of members and visitors, and good to see those that had not attended a worship service at Zion's in a while.

One topic addressed by Council relates to safety. During Sunday morning worship the front door of the church has been kept unlocked; however, new locks have recently been installed that will allow us to lock the front exterior door while still having the ability to quickly exit in case of emergency. In the near future, we will begin locking the front door once the church service begins. This will be an efficient way to safeguard our house of worship.


