Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

- ♣ Are we building in love?
- ♣ Are we building without walls?
- **Are we building beyond measure?**
- ♣ Are we building as one?
- ♣ Are we building up?
- ♣ Are we built to withstand?

These are the questions posed in the spring Bible study on Ephesians...questions that should, frankly, always be part of how we assess our current situation, the decisions we make, and the plans proposed as a congregation. Ephesians cautions us that building the ministry to which God has called us requires **being in unity with God**.

The Letter to the Ephesians was written to the congregation(s) established in the area known today as Turkey. These congregations were in an area highly influenced by Greek and Roman culture, striving to be clear on their identity as Christians among people strongly rooted in worship of Artemis (goddess of the hunt, chastity, and the moon).

It was a culture that boasted of having the largest marble temple ever built, dating back to over 500 years before the birth of Christ. It was destroyed and rebuilt several times...rebuilt as a sign of power and desire to give glory to the goddess, whom, they believed, would certainly bless the people in return.

The letter was written to the fledgling and growing Christian community to help them focus on how they *could* and *should* strive to give glory to God. And they weren't to be grounded or measured in an edifice of human design or construction. It was to be about BEING ONE IN SPIRIT, in thinking, in action with Christ, just as the Son is with the Father [READ: John 17 and Eph. 3.14-21. The life and strength of the Christian community depended on looking beyond human structure and culture, letting the Holy Spirit empower them to put faith into action.

That is exactly what is important for us today, as a Christian community. It must be about *oneness with God through relationship with Christ*. That relationship sets us apart from any other community or organization, and it is what is necessary for a congregation to *thrive*. A sure recipe for a congregation's demise is when the people are focused more on survival—keeping their building (*and/or congregation itself*) going—than on building themselves up in oneness with Christ to withstand the seductive practices of the culture around them.

A colleague of mine, lamenting what was happening in a congregation he had once served, commented that the people seemed more focused on the dinners and bazaars they were having to survive in their building than on meeting needs of the community around them. How much more fulfilled could they have been if they had pooled their resources and person-power to establish a food pantry, or teams to visit and support the sick, or reach out to and mentor area children and youth?!

The questions addressed in the study on Ephesians are, indeed, questions to always have in front of us, as we use the spiritual gifts God has given to u all. Ephesians 4.11 and 12 are at the core of the message of the study: *Christ gave gifts to all for building up the Body of Christ*.

Max Lucado, pastor and writer, in his daily devotional book *Grace for the Moment*, writes, "If unity matters to God, then shouldn't it matter to us?...Nowhere...are we told to *build* unity. We are told simply to *keep* unity...Unity does not need to be created; it simply needs to be protected...Does it mean that we abandon the truths we cherish? No. But it does mean we look long and hard at the attitudes we carry." Food for prayerful thought.

"Christmas in July" Hope Rescue Mission clothing drive

We are pleased to announce this year's WELCA Christmas in July project, a clothing drive for Hope Rescue Mission, Reading.
