Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

My colleague shared this encounter with a young child after worship one Sunday:

- CHILD: Pastor Bob, Jesus doesn't love me...
- Pr BOB: What do you mean? Of course Jesus loves you!
- CHILD: I didn't get the bread...

Fortunately, the Altar Guild hadn't cleared the altar yet, so Pr. Bob led the child to the altar and gave her a piece of communion bread, saying, "Always remember that Jesus DOES love you!" from that point on, he made sure every child received a piece of bread, even prior to any class time to learn about the sacrament.

Back when many of us were kids, the custom was to receive First Communion right after Confirmation. Then the Church started to rethink that practice as suggesting you have to "earn" the right to come to the Lord's Table.

The thinking then became that, since children could grasp the concept of forgiveness fairly well by the age of 10, fifth grade would a good time to instruct and serve them. But that was still problematic because it still suggested you had to reach a certain milestone to merit the right. And it stands in direct contradiction to how we believe and teach that *grace* is a gift from God that cannot be earned or merited.

It progressed, then, to "When the child starts to ask about it, the child is ready." My seminary professor told the story about a man whose 2-year-old little boy asked his father after worship, "Daddy, why can't I have breakfast with Jesus?" Clearly that little boy understood that people were sharing a meal with Jesus at the communion rail. Children understand according to what they experience.

You may have seen me give children a special blessing when they come to the Lord's Table with parents or grandparents—something that had been part of my practice starting 30 years ago. But, if you have seen more recently my interaction with children at the altar, you may have noticed that I have given them the bread (wafer) with the explanation that Jesus wants the child to know that he loves them. I am told that the first time one child received the bread, she talked about it all day, she was so happy!

So what about the traditional instruction, if the child has received bread with that particular blessing? Now is the time to have some age-appropriate sessions to talk in some depth about the holy meal, have some tasting time, and participate fully in the meal, hearing the specific words with "for you" with both the bread and the wine. From time to time throughout the Sunday School experience, as the child grows, we talk more about why we have this meal in worship. Specific sessions are part of the Confirmation program, as well.

Truth be told, no matter how old we are, we can never fully comprehend the full significance of this holy meal...because we cannot fully comprehend what God has done for us in Jesus. So we must not keep children from coming to the meal "until they understand it" because it's not fully going to happen in this life.

How often do we hear the lament that we don't see children in worship like we used to. Parents have a tough time when their children do not perceive that there is something here in worship for them, that it's only an adult thing we do. There are other things we can incorporate into the way we worship, as well, and we must be open to continuing to grow in our own understanding of how we can reach people with the Good News of Jesus Christ
