Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

With the advent of autumn comes a certain *transition* time once again...transition to the "regular" schedule, but, more importantly, transition to something new. New Sunday School and Confirmation classes. New adult studies. Some new music. Some new business for Council consideration. New fellowship events. New opportunities to make a difference for someone going through a difficult time.

The word "transition" brings to mind the reality that a healthy congregation is always in a state of transition. If not, it's like a stagnant pond where nothing grows any more...where there is no longer any life.

I have been serving Zion's as "Transition" Pastor and have been blessed to see new life as the years have come. The role of a Transition Pastor is to guide the congregation in moving from Point A to Point B, whether that means entering into shared ministry with another congregation or calling a pastor to part or full time service.

But several years ago, a colleague of mine shared with me a certain observation about his role as the "called" pastor to the congregation where he was serving: he referred to himself as "Transition Pastor…aren't we all supposed to be transition pastors, after all," he declared.

Truth be told, he was right! Pastors come and go, but the congregation's members tend to stay. So the important thing to remember is that members must seek to regularly and continually grow in faith and in understanding of the mission of the church.

One of my favorite sayings is that pastors are shepherds (from the root meaning of pastor"); the members are the sheep of the flock. It is the sheep who produce the wool...it is the members who make the difference.

In the fall we tend to revisit the ministry of stewardship, as we begin to plan for the coming calendar/fiscal year.

- ➤ How can each member make the difference to ensure the transition to the next important place?
- ➤ Considering how things go for us generally, are there a few extra dollars in our pocket at the end of the week that could make something new happen in and through the congregation?
- Are there a few hours in the week or the month where we find ourselves wondering what to do with our time...could serving on Altar Guild or the Choir or assisting with music or part of worship or service and fellowship ministry bring a sense of fulfillment while making things happen in and through the congregation?

In short, what can we each do to keep the congregation in transition, the state of growing?

While the notion of being in transition can be a bit unsettling, it should keep us on our toes, alert to any hurdles to overcome, alert to possibilities. It is not time to sit back and see what happens...it is time to *make things happen*.

Christ is counting on us all. On whom or on what are we counting?

Pastor's Fall Bible Study BEGINNING OCT. 11

Jonah: A Prophetic Message

In just four chapters, the story of Jonah's epic journey to proclaim God's message unfolds in a unique way...especially compared to other prophetic books. It's a story told to children in Sunday School—probably where you first heard it. But can we take it literally? Is there historical basis for it? Because it is in the Bible, we must discern its message.

We will take a look at what constitutes prophecy, how it developed in the Old Testament, how a prophet is considered "major" or "minor", and how the unique Book of Jonah fits in with other prophets, both major and minor. We'll read excerpts from other prophets as well as Jonah.

Starting October 11, we'll meet Wednesday mornings (10:30 am) at Zion's and on ZOOM in the evenings (7:00 pm) in October and conclude before Thanksgiving. A study book on Jonah is available.

Journey in Faith *Via de Cristo*

A special opportunity for better understanding of the Christian faith in a weekend 3-day experience in our area in the month of October

Via de Cristo is Spanish for the "Way of Christ". It is the Lutheran expression of a renewal movement developed within the Church in the 1940s in Spain, and originally known as *Cursillo*, a Spanish word meaning "short course" in Christianity.

Originating in the Spanish Catholic Church, it is intended to be a step-by-step structured weekend with several talks given by lay persons active in their congregations and a few talks given by clergy in a progression that puts the faith and the work of the church into clearer perspective than one might otherwise have, even in weekly worship and regular Bible study. It has proven to be of great benefit to individuals who attend a weekend, and in congregations where they are members.

This renewal movement exists in many denominations besides the Lutheran Church. In the Roman Catholic Church and the Episcopal Church, it is known as *Cursillo*. In the Methodist Church it is called "Walk to Emmaus". The movement also exists in several other denominations, including a cross-denomination experience called *Tres Dias* (Three Days).

In Berks County, members at Faith Lutheran, Mount Penn, Reformation Lutheran, (Reiffton) Reading, and Christ Lutheran, Oley, have found this to be noticeably beneficial for the congregation, not to mention in their personal faith lives.

There are *VdC* communities in many states across the country, as well as in countries around the world. The Journey in Faith community serves Eastern PA. drawing primarily from York, Camp Hill, and Reading areas, and from Delaware.

The fall 2023 Journey in Faith weekend begins Thursday evening October 12, and comes to a close Sunday afternoon October 15. It is held at Camp Innabah, a Methodist camp a few miles south of Coventry Mall, Pottstown, just off Route 100. There is information on the national website: *Via de Cristo* National Lutheran Secretariat, as well as on the Journey in Faith *VdC* website and FaceBook page...or simply ask Pastor Diane LaFauci for more information.


