Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

This time of the year seems always to be more hectic than the rest of the year...Thanksgiving, preparing for Christmas, baking (for those so inclined), finally Christmas...followed by New Year's Eve.

The carols we hear spread the notion of "Peace on earth..." when all around us seems anything but peaceful!

I do love the season, with its decorations and lighting displays. I am ok with lights and displays in the stores *after* Hallowe'en and Thanksgiving.

I change the seasonal touches at home in the kitchen and great room. The pillows on the sofa and chairs clearly reflect wintry scenes. And, of course, the Christmas trees (yes, *trees*, the main one for the family Christmas gathering, plus some smaller trees with unique decorations or with special memory significance) come out of storage. The outside lighting changes from fall to Christmas/winter...and will stay that way at least thru January. The indoor trees get to stay up past the Day of Epiphany (Jan. 6) and for as long as I choose to enjoy them.

I bring out my little Santas from different countries, and I have a special display of my Swedish figures, including the straw goat that "Tomte" (the Christmas gnome) rides thru the Swedish countryside bringing gifts into the snow-covered villages and farms. I try to prepare one or two Swedish dishes...remembering Christmas gatherings with my father's side of the family. I lament the fact that I did not inherit from my mother the love and the energy needed for baking cookies. Perhaps, if I am ever truly "retired" at Christmas time, I might have time to try my hand at some of Mom's tried-and-true cookie recipes!

But in the church, it's a "different world", as we strive to emphasize that "place away" from this world where we might focus with intention on God coming among us as a human child... under circumstances to which we *might* relate, had we lived 2,000 years ago in a place and a culture so removed from our world today.

We bring out the Advent wreath, lighting the candles in counter-clockwise order to signify that God's time is different from our time. And finally we transition the sanctuary for Christmas, and the carols we sing reflect the special joy of Christ's coming among us.

God's timing was perfect and always will be. With the way things are today, how in the world would anyone have even noticed? Shepherds in the fields?? Kings from the East?? Who would be summoned to come and how: by angels in the sky over the fields or text message or breaking news on TV? Would it be like paparazzi outside the London hospital waiting for the birth of the heir to the throne?

No...God's plan was, and always had been, perfection. Simple and straightforward. And that is why we tell the story and again and again without letting the outside world in.

We have special services planned for later in the month of December: Dec. 24 at 10:30am for Advent Scripture & Song (we review the words of the prophets who foretold the birth of Messiah and reflect on those messages of hope in the songs we sing) and then Dec 31 at 10:30am for Lessons & Carols (where we rejoice with the Nativity story and the time of the infant Jesus).

Of course, we gather on Christmas Eve, Sunday this year, at 4pm an 7pm to relive the glorious birth of a baby in an intimate space far from any paparazzi. A baby who would impact all of humanity forever...more than any other royal birth.

The glory of God revealed for our longing souls and hearts!

May you know and experience the peace that only God can give through Jesus!

At our Church Council meeting on November 7, we found ourselves in the favorable position of discussing a pastoral candidate and reviewing the procedure to call a pastor! The Call Committee met the candidate and recommended her to Church Council. We then met with her and voted to move forward with the process. A meet and greet open house is scheduled for December 2 from 2:00 to 4:00 in the fellowship hall, with a trial sermon the next day, Sunday, December 3. Immediately after the service, a congregational meeting will be held with a member of the Synod staff officiating and a vote will be taken. A quorum of 50 people is required, so we encourage everyone to attend.

The proposed budget was discussed and will be finalized at the December meeting. Church Council recognized the commitment that WELCA has made toward supporting a new pastor by pledging \$5000 a year for 5 years toward the pastor's salary.

Council accepted the resignation of Ruth Hoppes from her position of cleaning the church. We thank Ruth for her commitment and service for well over 20 years in this position! Don Ryan has been hired as her replacement.

The Library Committee has plans to have the Sunday School children tour the library during class to make them aware of the resources and interesting things to be found there.

As part of a donation from Irwin Levan, a bench was purchased for use in the labyrinth, and was dedicated in memory of his wife, Ella Mae Levan.

QUALIFIED CHARITABLE DISTRIBUTIONS

A qualified distribution (QCD) is a simple and taxsmart way to give to the church.

- If you are 70 ½ or older, you can make a Qualified Charitable Distribution of \$100,000 or less of your required minimum distribution (RMD) annually.
- Giving directly from your IRA can reduce your annual gross income and lower your taxes. You are not taxed by the IRS on this type of distribution.
- Distributions must be made directly from a traditional IRA account by your plan administrator to Zion's.
- Discuss with your investment advisor to arrange for the QCD distribution to be made. Distributions can be transmitted to the church quarterly, semi-annually, or annually.


