Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

As I begin to write this month's letter, it feels like summer. I'll surely enjoy porch time as I prepare the sermon for Reformation Sunday and continue plans for All Saints Sunday.

But as sure as I'm sitting here, I'm acutely aware of how things can change quickly in life—the weather not withstanding. The Phillies' hopes were dashed in the 7<sup>th</sup> game in the lead-up to the World Series...it was just the right pitch and the right hit...(or perhaps the wrong pitch, the wrong hit...it's all in the eye of the beholder).

The bottom line is that things can change, whether you see it coming or not. November certainly does usher us into the reality of fall and prepare us for the coming of (dare we say it?) winter. But November also brings us to Christ the King Sunday and the hope/reality of the *End Time*. We begin with the Remembrance Rite on All Saints Sunday (always the first Sunday in November). This bitter/sweet moment in worship is meant to give us hope of things to come: our own entrance into the eternal presence of God by the grace of Jesus Christ.

All Lives Matter! Yes, to God, <u>all</u> lives matter, and the message on Christ the King Sunday (last Sunday of the liturgical year, always in November and just before the beginning of Advent) is just that! We matter to God!! God wants to receive each one of us into God's eternal dwelling place we know as *heaven*. That is the one sure thing that does not change!!

Honestly, as much as I would like to know exactly what that will be like, I won't until I am received there...I have no idea when that might be. In the meantime, I must continue to live each day to the glory of God, for so much is at stake in the world.

That being said, if I am truly Jesus' disciple, I must consider *why* I do everything I do: is it because people think more highly of me if I do all these things? because it makes me feel good about myself as I tally up what I do—especially in and thru the church? or do I stop to think about what I do as *actual ministry according to the mission to which God has called me*—that is to say: my *grateful response to God*? When I think in those terms, it *changes* everything for me! And that change is, indeed, good!

November brings each one of us an opportunity to rethink what we do. Is it just about making us feel good about ourselves? *Or is what we do and what we give our grateful response to God?*
