When he had finished speaking, he said to Simon, "Put out into deep water and let down your nets for a catch" - Luke 5:4

After working over fifteen years in Information Technology I started to feel restless. I loved the challenge of coding and testing – trial and error – and the satisfaction when I finally resolved an issue or create the code necessary to deliver a new function to an existing application. I was a good programmer analyst, yet I felt like I was not where I belonged – not doing what God intended. What could it be? Where did God want me to go? What did God need me to do?

Have you ever felt like you were out of place? Although, you had been doing something for a long time and were proficient doing it, maybe you were meant to move in a different direction. Perhaps it did not make sense. Did you wonder what else you were "qualified" to do or what job you could get that would provide the necessary income to support your family?

Why would you leave a comfortable job – one that you had done for a long time – one that you were proficient at performing – one that brought in a good income?

Often what makes sense to Jesus is absurd to our human minds. We frequently resist, because we are human and our logical minds get in the way. Logic is more comfortable to humans than what God sometimes calls us to do.

Remember the fisherman disciples made careers of catching fish. After they had experienced a very long fruitless day on the water, imagine their response when Jesus (a career carpenter) told them to try something different – to throw logic to the wind and drop their nets again in what they "knew" was an empty and unproductive sea.

If the fishermen had not listened to Jesus' instructions and instead followed their human logic, they would have missed that abundant blessing of that catch. Beyond that practical job-related win, they would have missed the opportunity to see Jesus for who He is and His ability to be transformative in their lives every day.

I remember the day I decided to trust the call of God, defy human logic by pursuing entering the ELCA Candidacy process. I remember along the way the twists and turns – wondering whether this is really what God intends – often because my human logic was trying to override God's call. What did I learn along the way?

God has gifted each of us with talents to build up the body of Christ. Take advantage of all the opportunities God places in our path to reveal and help us to develop those talents. God has a plan for our lives and calls us in many different ways to follow that path. Listen God is calling us to continue His ministry - to be His hands and feet on earth to love and serve following His example. Practice patience and persistence when answering God's call. Set aside human logic and trust God!

Some exciting upcoming events were discussed. During the August 4th worship service, a representative from Tree 4 Hope will speak to the congregation. Tree 4 Hope is a non-profit organization committed to providing a bright future of long-term hope for children, elders, and their families in Guatemala and around the world through educational, health, and mental wellness outreach programs. Please attend worship that morning if you are able, to learn about this important mission and ways that we can offer our support.

In the fall, Pastor Stephanie plans to hold a book study on *The Gift of Forgiveness*. Keep an eye out for more information and please consider joining in!

In addition, Lucille Gough talked about Via de Cristo, which is scheduled for October 10-13, 2024. Via de Cristo (Way of Christ) is a three-day experience for Christians who are already active in their congregations and who may benefit from a deeper understanding of the Christian faith and Christ's mission to help their congregation where it is planted in the community. 
