It is often said that change is inevitable. If we are honest, many of us will admit that we really dislike change. Why do we dislike change? Do we really dislike change or is it really the fear of the unknown associated with change that makes us uncomfortable?

Well, change may be inevitable with many aspects of our lives. However, there is something that never changes – the promise of God to be with us forever and walk with us through all those changes in our lives.

Do not fear, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by name, you are mine. When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and through the rivers, they shall not overwhelm you; when you walk through fire you shall not be burned, and the flame shall not consume you. (Isaiah 43:1a-2)

In Baptism, we are "sealed by the Holy Spirit and mark by the cross of Christ forever". The light of Christ is in us and the Holy Spirit accompanies us through all the changes in life - both expected and unexpected ones.

Seasons of nature come and go. Our life goes through seasons of change. And through it all, we are the Body of Christ, a family of faith here to accompany and support each other and God is always with us! That my friends **never** changes. Thanks be to God!


