- "Christmas in July" collection for In Ian's Boots that provided hundreds of pairs of gently used shoes & boots to be distributed locally, nationally and internationally.
- Zions Community Garden that continues to provide bountiful harvests throughout the summer to local food pantries to feed our local neighbors in need.
- "Summer of Hope" looking for signs of hope during the summer and providing \$500 in support to children and families in Guatemala through Tree 4 Hope.
- Zions Trek for ELCA World Hunger walkers and bikers raised \$1030 while enjoying the Bartram Trail on a beautiful fall morning
- Nativity Display that welcomed many people from the community and collected \$891 in donations for Domestic Lutheran Domestic Disaster Response.
- "Jesus, Jammies and Joy" gratitude month project that collected 297 pairs of children's pajamas incorporating 3 additional partners collecting donations and distributing to 5 programs in two counties.

Truly our "wagon tracks" have overflowed with abundance in the past year that we have shared with our neighbors near and far. I look forward to discovering what new ministry opportunities God will place in our path in 2025.

The council reviewed the Treasurer's report for November. As of the end of November, our year-to-date balance was a positive \$37,201. It was also reported that the church roof has been fully paid for, and the new roof, soffit, fascia, and gutters have all been installed.

It was announced that during November, 297 pairs of pajamas were collected for the Jesus, Jammies & Joy initiative to be donated to children in need. We thank everyone who contributed to this cause.

We also appreciate the donations of wreaths for Zion's Cemetery, supporting the Wreaths Across America program. The Scouts, in partnership with the cemetery, raised enough funds to purchase a wreath for every veteran's grave, which were placed during a ceremony on December 14, 2024. We are grateful to have had the opportunity to honor the veterans.

We hope everyone had a joyful holiday season and look forward to seeing all members at the Zion's Evangelical Lutheran Church Annual Congregational Meeting on Sunday, January 26, 2025 (with a snow date of February 2, 2025).

# QUALIFIED CHARITABLE DISTRIBUTIONS

A qualified distribution (QCD) is a simple and taxsmart way to give to the church.

- If you are 70 ½ or older, you can make a Qualified Charitable Distribution of \$100,000 or less of your required minimum distribution (RMD) annually.
- Giving directly from your IRA can reduce your annual gross income and lower your taxes. You are not taxed by the IRS on this type of distribution.
- Distributions must be made directly from a traditional IRA account by your plan administrator to Zion's.
- Discuss with your investment advisor to arrange for the QCD distribution to be made. Distributions can be transmitted to the church quarterly, semi-annually, or annually.


