## Zion's Messenger - February 2025



If I speak in the tongues of mortals and of angels, but do not have love, I am a noisy gong or a clanging cymbal. If I have prophetic powers, and understand all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have all faith, so as to remove mountains, but do not have love, I am nothing. If I give away all my possessions, and if I hand over my body so that I may boast, but do not have love, I gain nothing. (1 Cor. 13:1–3)

February, the shortest month of the year, has arrived. Most of us are tired of winter with the limited daylight and fed up with the bitter cold weather. Likely, most of us are longing for spring. That makes the shortest month of the year feel all that much longer. Of course, in February sports fans look forward to the Super Bowl and Daytona 500, and baseball fans are excited about the start of spring training. Many people in the workforce look forward to a long weekend with the President's Day Holiday. Beyond those things, all there is in February to look forward to is Valentine's Day. St Valentine, the namesake of this holiday, was a 3rd century saint who was martyred for his care of the faithful during times of persecution. How a 'holy day' commemorating him evolved into a day associated with romantic love is something of a historical question.

As I think about Saint Valentine, and Valentine's Day, and all that's happened around us and around the world the past few years, I'm reminded of what Jesus said when asked what the greatest commandment is: "The most important one," answered Jesus, "is this: 'Hear, O Israel, the Lord our God, the Lord is one. Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength.' The second is this: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' There is no commandment greater than these." (Mark 12:29–31) Love. That's what we need to center our live on. Many of us remember singing the hymn, "They'll Know We Are Christians by Our Love". Unfortunately, that doesn't seem to be what Christians are known for these days. We seem to either be known for what we fear or what makes us angry. Maybe this Valentine's Day (and month) we should strive to return to the way of love.

As Paul writes in the passage quoted at the beginning of my message, if we don't have love, we're just making noise, having nothing, gaining nothing. The way to truly experience and share the love of God in our homes, neighborhoods and world is through love. Loving God (Mark 12:30), loving one another (John 15:12), loving our neighbors (Mark 12:31); "Who is my neighbor?": Luke 10:25-37), even loving our enemies (Matt 5:44). That seems to cover everyone in our lives. Loving others day in and day out is hard...but the pathway to love is really straightforward. Take a moment to ask yourself, in every conversation, encounter and action, "Is this word or deed a way to show the love of Christ to this person?" Of course, it's an easy thing to think and ask ourselves — doing it is definitely more difficult. Wouldn't it be fantastic if we were known for our love rather than our anger and fear? That might just be enough to begin to change the world.

We love because he first loved us. Those who say, "I love God," and hate their brothers or sisters, are liars; for those who do not love a brother or sister whom they have seen, cannot love God whom they have not seen. The commandment we have from him is this: those who love God must love their brothers and sisters also.


